- 7. To attend meetings concerning the promotion and development of the project.

- 9. To help raise awareness of the need for independent support and to participate in the delivery of training programmes related to the Project's work.
- 10. To ensure that service users are treated with due dignity and respect at all times.
- 11. To report back to the Project Co-ordinator, perceived risks or crisis situations which may be developing.
