2019 Awards

The Parish Council will be running its Young People's Awards again in 2019. Introduced last year, the scheme is designed to highlight achievements of young people in Bishop's Cleeve, such as being a carer, volunteering, helping others or overcoming a barrier including illness or disability. There are four categories this year: Junior Award for 6 to13 year olds; Senior Award for 14 to 19 year olds; a Group Award and a Special Recognition Award. Each category winner will receive a £100 voucher of their choice and there will be a £50 voucher for the runner up, as well as a small trophy to keep. The winners will be invited to attend the Annual Parish Meeting in April to receive their awards.

Nominees must live within the parish at the time of their nomination. The closing date is 1st March 2019.

Reviewing the JCS

The Joint Core Strategy (JCS) is the strategic level plan for Cheltenham, Gloucester and Tewkesbury setting out how the area will be developed A review, called up until 2031. 'Issues and Options', is currently underway. Members of the public may take part in the initial consultation which runs through to 11th January 2019. Tewkesbury Borough Plan

Tewkesbury Borough Council has issued a draft plan for the borough. This sits underneath the JCS to provide more locally specific policy. The plan will allocate sites for housing and employment development as well as provide planning policies to guide future development in the borough. It covers a period up to 2031. Based upon comments received from a consultation on 'preferred options', closing on 30th November, the plan will be refined and the public will have a further opportunity to comment at the presubmission phase which is likely to be in Spring 2019. Evesham Road: development in progress

As many residents are aware, the Lidl store closed in October with work starting immediately to demolish the old building and construct a larger store which is scheduled to open in summer 2019. Details of the plans for the new Lidl store (ref 17/00133/FUL) and additional 18/00812/FUL) parking (ref are available to view online on the Tewkesbury Borough Council website.

Land to the rear of Lidl, with access off Evesham Road is also, separately, being developed to provide 9 new houses. Plans (ref 18/00025/APP) were approved in autumn and work is now underway.
