#### Local Elections: 2<sup>nd</sup> May

Borough and Parish Council elections, organised by Tewkesbury Borough Council, will take place on 2<sup>nd</sup> May.

You don't need any special qualifications or experience to be a councillor but must be over 18 years old and meet qualification criteria regarding citizenship and living or working within the parish. Parish councillors are expected to attend monthly Full Council meetings and take part in committees which meet separately throughout the year.

### **Grange Field Takes Shape**



The construction phase of work at Grange Field, to create an enhanced and inclusive public open space, is almost complete. The next stage of the project, managed by Tewkesbury Borough Council and part-funded by the European Regional Development Fund, will see the planting of up to 60 trees, of varied species, over the site, whilst the watercourse will be monitored to see how it reacts and stabilises. Wildflower mixes and native bulbs will be planted in due course and the meadow will become more diverse over the years as different plants establish themselves.

### **Reducing Parish Council Energy Bills**

A solar photovoltaic system has recently been installed in the Parish Office, converting sunlight to electricity which can be stored in a battery or exported back to the grid when load exceeds demand. Parish Office running costs will be reduced and the Council is pleased to be using a clean energy source. Installation was funded through Section 106 funds - a contribution for the community from housing developers made under planning legislation.

#### **Cheltenham Festival Traffic: 12th to 15th March**



Last year's arrangements for local traffic will be repeated for the March race meeting. The A435 will close southbound between the traffic lights at Newlands Park and the main entrance to the racecourse from 10.00a.m. to 1.30p.m. and again from 4.30p.m. to 8.00p.m. Northbound traffic will not be stopped. The Stagecoach D and E bus services will run as normal during the morning rush hour but be diverted later in the day. Details will be advertised on the buses and available on their website www.stagecoachbus.com. The usual traffic arrangements will be in place in the village, including closure of Voxwell Lane at key times.

#### **Reducing Cleeve's Litter Problem**

Residents have reported concerns about the increasing amount of litter in the village. This includes fast-food packaging, cans and bottles, as well as food remnants which, of course, attract vermin. The Parish Council has installed many litter bins in the area and works with Tewkesbury Borough Council to arrange regular bin emptying and monitor fly-tipping issues.

#### What can you do?

- Use a bin for your rubbish, if out and about, or take your litter, particularly food items, home with you for disposal.
- If you see accumulations of litter or fly-tipping in a public place, report it online to the borough council www.tewkesbury.gov.uk/do-it-online/
- Join the volunteer litter picker scheme, organised by Tewkesbury Borough Council. Volunteers must be aged 18 or over and will receive training and appropriate equipment. #### Do you care for someone with dementia,

and have concerns that symptoms of disorientation and confusion may cause them to go missing? You could help by signing up to the Herbert Protocol, which is a national scheme, supported by the Alzheimer's Society and, locally, by Gloucestershire Constabulary. Family, friends or carers can complete a simple form providing information about the person with dementia, which could include both regular routines and also previous addresses or places which may be a draw to them. ## **Dog Walkers**



Please look after your dog and others by keeping dogs on a lead where requested; clearing up and disposing of faeces in bins provided and making sure

dogs are only exercised where permitted. Remember dogs are not allowed anywhere on the Parish Council sportsfield for health and safety reasons. Dog mess is not only unpleasant but can cause infections including toxocariasis which may lead to serious conditions such as asthma and, in some cases, blindness. The eggs of the roundworm which causes this infection can stay alive in soil for many years - long after any dog mess has disappeared.
