# 2018 AWARDS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

Do you know of a young person who deserves an award?

The Parish Council has just launched an annual Young Persons Award to highlight the achievements of young people in Bishop's Cleeve. The Council recognises that many younger people in the community make a valuable contribution and wishes to mark this with an award. Examples of behaviour, which would be considered for the award, include fundraising, being a carer, volunteering, overcoming a barrier including illness or disability, helping others.

There are two age categories: 6-12 years and 13-19 years. Each winner will receive a £100 voucher of their choice and there will be a £50 voucher for each runner-up, as well as medals and framed certificates for all four. Both winners will have their names engraved on a cup which they will hold for a year and they will also be invited to open the Bishop's Cleeve Street Fair next June.

## WAR MEMORIAL RESTORATION

Works to restore the village war memorial will take place early next year in readiness for the centenary marking the end of World War One. The memorial was damaged over thirty five years ago when it was moved to its current location in Church Road and restoration works will include providing a new shaft to return the memorial to its original height. The stone cross, which has eroded will be replaced and both the memorial and paved area around it, will be cleaned.

Are there names to be added to the memorial? The Parish Council will consider requests to add names to commemorate service personnel who lost their lives in either of the two world wars or in conflicts since then. Criteria include the person having been a local resident (Bishop's Cleeve, Southam, Woodmancote or Cleeve Hill); their death must be supported by military records and formal documentation and they must not be recorded on another memorial. # Good news! Parish Council awarded costs

Following Gladman Developments Ltd abrupt withdrawal of their appeal, in March this year, against Tewkesbury Borough Council's decision to refuse planning permission for the erection of up to 265 dwellings at Stoke Road (TBC ref: 15/00166/OUT), the Parish Council put in an application for an award of costs against Gladman Developments Ltd. A decision has recently been made, by The Planning Inspectorate, which is to award partial costs to the Parish Council on the grounds of "unreasonable" behaviour resulting in wasted or unnecessary expense. The Parish Council will now submit details of the costs incurred in this matter.

# TRAFFIC SPEEDS - New signs coming soon!

Many residents have raised concerns about the volume and speed of traffic in Bishop's Cleeve. To try to improve driver awareness of speed restrictions, the Parish Council, in partnership with Gloucestershire County Council Highways Department, will be purchasing Vehicle Activated Signs to be used in prominent locations across the village. The Vehicle Activated Signs will be mounted on poles and moved from one location to another at determined intervals. The signs will display either the speed of the oncoming vehicle or the set speed restriction of the highway. The signs will also have data-logging facilities to allow the collation of data on each road over a period time. It is anticipated that the signs will be in place early in the new year.



#### DOG FOULING



Dog fouling continues to be a problem in the village. Whilst the majority of dog owners are responsible and 'pick-up' after their dogs, there are incidents of fouling particularly along grass verges and pathways in areas such as Finlay Way and Gotherington Lane to

Millham Road Playing Field at the rear of Wagtail Grove. It is an offence not to clear up after your dog.

Dog waste bags are available from the Parish Office: 50 bags cost £1.00.

#### VIEWS ON STREET LIGHTING

Since the installation of LED lighting, the Parish Council has received some queries from residents about lighting adequacy adjustments. New gym equipment has recently been installed at Pecked Lane playing field thanks to an initiative from Cleeve School pupils who have worked in partnership with Cleeve Vale Rotary Club to raise money in contribution to its funding. Equipment is also available for public use in Sunrise Avenue playing field and the sportsfield on Cheltenham Road.

Users of the Cheltenham Road sportsfield will also have noticed that the Council has now installed more security cameras to help reduce the amount of vandalism and anti-social behaviour in this area. When using the sportsfield please be aware that the gates to the entrance are locked at 9.00p.m.

#### SAFETY ON PAVEMENTS

#### Look out for each other!

Residents have expressed concern about the use of powered wheelchairs and scooters in the village. Whilst the majority of users give due regard to pedestrians there are occasions when the speed at which they are being driven has led to near misses.

Powered wheelchairs and scooters MUST NOT travel faster than 4 mph (6 km/h) on pavements or in pedestrian areas. Users should show consideration for other pavement users, particularly those with a hearing or visual impairment who may not be aware, and where pedestrians cannot move out of the way quickly enough or where the pavement is too narrow.

## RECYCLING CENTRE, BISHOP'S CLEEVE

Wingmoor Farm Household Recycling Centre is open to the public, but **please note the entrance on Stoke Road is first left after the railway bridge** (when approaching from Bishop's Cleeve). This is not to be confused with the entrance to Grundon Waste Management, the commercial operator, which is also located on Stoke Road. This is a private site and the company has experienced problems with cars entering their premises, by mistake. This is potentially dangerous as it brings drivers into a restricted traffic system where heavy vehicles are manoeuvring on site. The public recycling centre is open every day from 9:00am to 6:15pm (except Christmas Day and New Year's Day).
