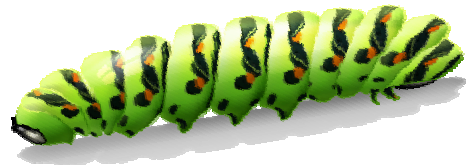

We used a scatter gun approach

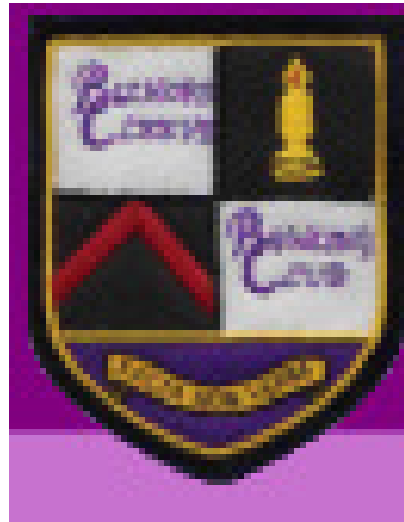

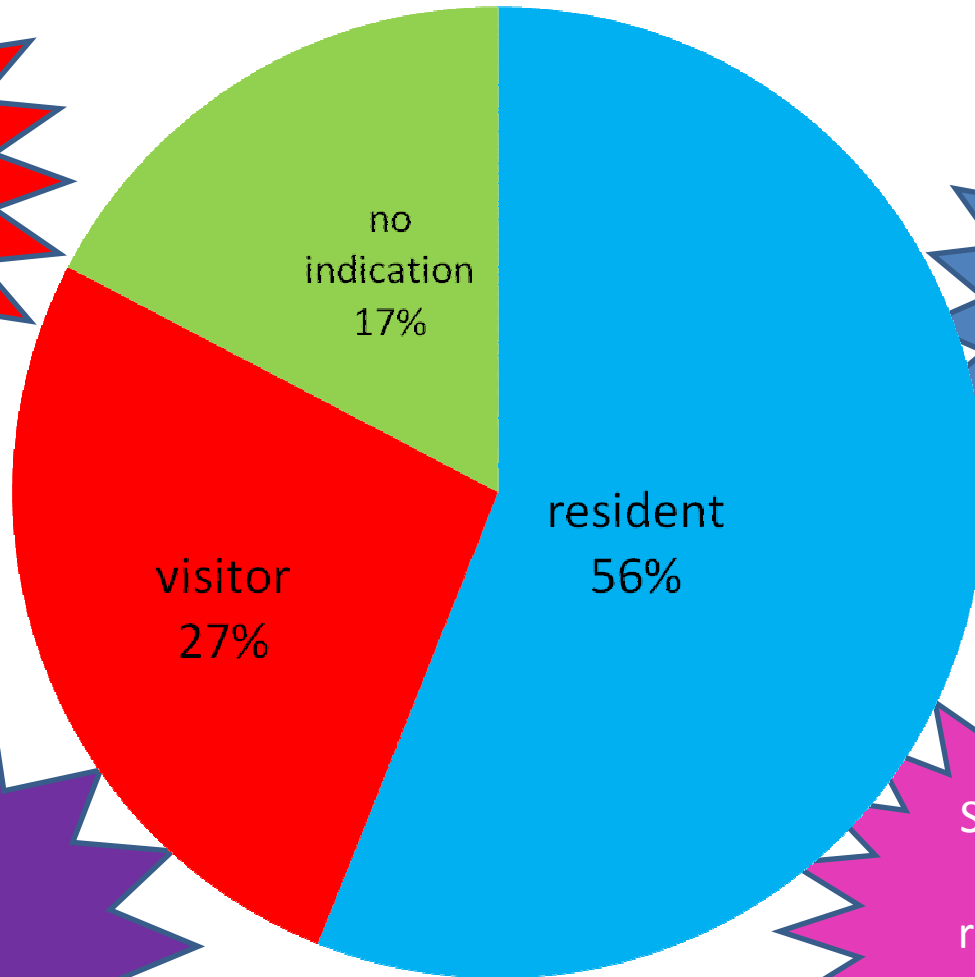

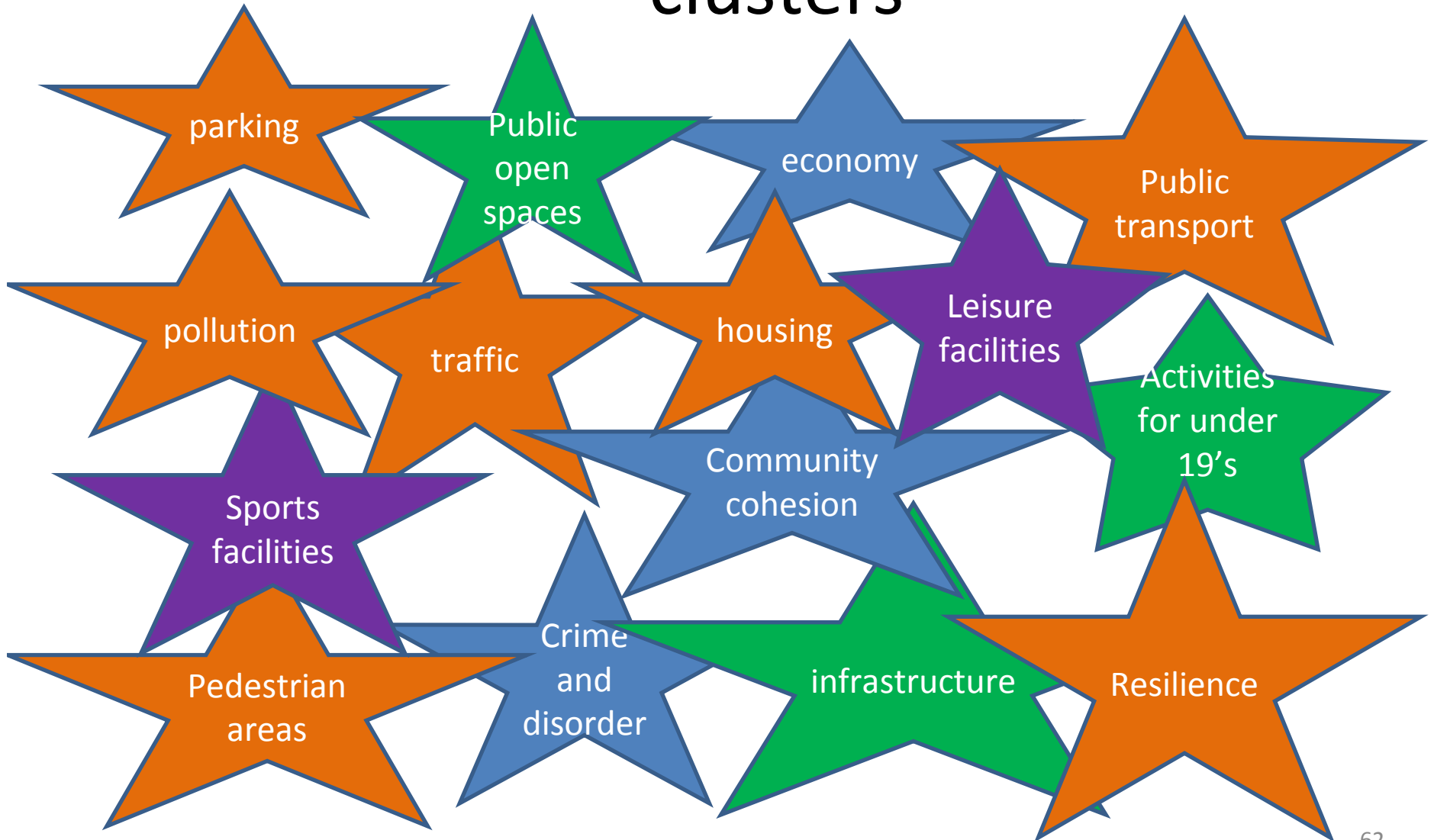
