Back to Business and to banish the winter blues we have been looking through fuchsia catalogues and have placed an order with Percival's Fuchsias for delivery in February. I found a fuchsia called *Tidler* – it's a small upright, single, white/reddish purple which certainly caught my eye, as a comical name and I thought I might even bonsai my *Tidler*. Watch this space.

Looking today at my plants, I see my hardwood cuttings of Corallina have a couple of new shoots growing on them. I stuck about 7 or 8 around the rim of a pot and, I guess it is early days, but there is a bit of movement with two of them. I have never grown hardwood cuttings before so I'll take these new shoots off and plant them as a normal cutting. Otherwise I would have bits of growth sticking out sideways on 8"/10" pieces of old wood, which would not look good. This was the plant growing in my neighbour's garden; it has horizontal, spreading growth and wonderful deep-green russet coloured foliage. It was hybridised in 1844 so I thought it may be an addition in the pre 1914 class.

We have all but sold out of the Standard Whips and have only 5 varieties remaining,

Elma, Gotenborg, Paula Jane, Southgate, Waltz Jubelteen, and only limited numbers of them. Fowey Fuchsias tripled their order and we were unable to fulfil Plympton's completely. Good isn't it?

So good on you, all of our great members, thank you for your support during 2012 and here is hoping 2013 will be even better.

Tube white, short and fairly thick. Sepals white, long, broad, held over the corolla and turning up at the tips. Corolla pure white, very large with pleated and folded petals. Full, fluffy blooms. Foliage mid-green, medium sized, finely serrated leaves. Growth natural trailer, vigorous and fairly free-flowering, but one that requires pinching in its early stages to get it into shape. A superb cultivar, well worth growing. Basket.

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
