Man in life threatening condition after Storrington collision

Police are appealing for witnesses to a serious collision in Storrington on Saturday (October 8).

A grey Mini one was travelling north on Mill Lane at around 4.45pm and collided with a silver Ford Galaxy travelling south.

A 20-year-old man from Storrington, the driver of the Mini, is in a life threatening condition in hospital. The driver of the Ford, a 35-year-old woman from Pulborough, suffered a broken hand.

Hot tubs stolen from Washington garden centre

Police are seeking thieves who stole two hot tubs from a garden centre in West Sussex.

Between about 8.30pm and midnight on Friday (7 October), two men broke into the display area at the rear of Squires garden centre on the busy A24 in London Road, Washington, went to the compound of Euphoria Lifestyles at the back of the area and stole two hot tubs, valued at £8600 and £6050 respectively.

Due to the size of the tubs it is assumed they must have had a vehicle of some kind to take them away.

A photo of one of the suspects, together with the back view of a second, has been published by the police.

PC Tessa Heath said: "Anyone who saw any suspicious activity around Squires that evening. or who thinks they may recognise that man, is asked to contact us via 101@sussex.pnn.police.ukor call 101, quoting serial 443 of 08/10."

Inspector Simon Starns said: "We are aware this is a trend that has come over from America as Halloween is approaching."However while it is not an offence to dress up as a clown and prank your mates, we don't advise people to do this to strangers..."

Inspector Kcknight added "The issues of intimidation, potential arrest and waste of public resources are the same across the country and we would urge people to refrain from such activity. However, we would also urge anyone to report incidents to police so that we can deal with them."

Inspector Mcknight said "As with previous Hallowe'ens, we would ask that parents or guardians make sure that young children are supervised while 'trick or treating'. If you have teenage children who are planning to trick or treat, please ensure that you know where they are going, what time they will be home and remind them to stay with their friends."
