Police appeal for witnesses to fatal crash on the A29 north-west of Horsham

Police are appealing for witnesses to a crash on the A29 Bognor Road close to the Sussex/Surrey border north-west of Horsham which sadly claimed the life of a motorcyclist.

It happened at the A29's junction with Marches Road, west of Kingsfold, at around 1.10pm on Sunday (13 November) and involved a black Honda CBR600 motorcycle and a silver Iveco-Ford horsebox lorry.

Despite the efforts of a doctor and paramedics to save him the motorcyclist died at the scene. He has since been named as Darren Arnell, aged 42, from Bognor Regis.

The lorry driver, a 43-year-old woman from Warnham, was unhurt.

Two horses in the vehicle were unloaded at a nearby farm, both having been left in a distressed state by the collision.

The A29 was closed for some four-and-a-half hours while emergency services, including the Kent, Surrey and Sussex air ambulance, were in attendance.

Sgt Tony Crisp, of the Sussex and Surrey road policing unit, said: "We'd like to hear from anyone who saw the collision or who noticed either vehicle being driven shortly beforehand.

"They are asked to email collision.appeal@sussex.pnn.police.uk or phone 101, quoting Operation Riverstown."

He added: "Because of the need to impose road closures, we'd also like to thank people whose journeys were disrupted for their patience and understanding."
