Match Report

Isabella combined intelligently with Annie to set up Emily on the edge of the area. Emily's powerful shot was only half-stopped by the Keeper and the ball squeezed inside the post. The early goal gave the girls confidence and they continued to press forward. Isabella had a fine effort saved before Emily and Isabella combined to give Rose an effort on goal which went just wide. Poppleton were dangerous on the counter-attack and Amelia and Abbi had to be on their toes to protect Freya in goal, but she wasn't really tested in a half dominated by BWR. The half ended with BWR 1-0 up. Towards the end of the half the girls had started to look tired and this continued at the start of the second half as Poppleton came into the game, now with the wind advantage. They never stopped running and showed incredible resilience to keep going. Annie battled all over the pitch and she has finally started to shoot on sight and it very nearly paid off. Isabella showed her class with some superb runs and was easily the most skilful player on the pitch. Up front Rose ran herself into the ground, making intelligent forward runs and creating problems for the Poppleton defence. Towards the end of the game she had to drop back into midfield and she continued to put in 100% for the team. Wendy was our super sub, having to come on in various positions to cover injuries and illness.
