The main problem for Benwick has been the theft of number plates,

Whittlesey were experiencing similar a couple of months ago. If your number plates are stolen from your car/vehicle you need to report it straight away. Approximately 40,000 cases of number plate thefts were reported across

England last year.

Cllr Butcher reported that Fenland District Council will now have to save £2.2 million over next 4 years. Areas that can be cut back will now be looked into. Cllr Clark reported that CCC also has to make significant savings. CCC will increase wages from the minimum wage to the living wage. Services to the villages could be reduced.
