	5 x Hare coursing reports called in effecting Benwick and the surrounding areas. This type of incident is initially dealt with by a dedicated team, along with local and reactive officers. Nothing else of note reported.	
	Concerns regarding Hare Coursing:- Police have relaunched an operation in a bid to combat hare coursing in Cambridgeshire enabling rapid response to calls, and patrolling areas where hare coursing is prevalent. Hare coursing is a blood sport which is a 'banned and illegal activity'. Sadly local Famers are often faced with damage to their fields and property, affecting their businesses.	
	 Hare coursing mainly affects East Cambridgeshire, South Cambridgeshire and the Fens. The Hunting Act 2004 made hare coursing illegal and anyone convicted of the offence can be fined up to £5,000 by a magistrates' court. The most obvious sign of hare coursing are:- A group of vehicles parked in a rural area, for instance by a gateway 	
	 to farmland, on a grass verge or farm track or bridle path. There will usually be estate cars, four-wheel-drives or vans. Dogs used are normally Lurcher's or a similar type of breed. Vehicles may contain evidence of dogs inside, such as muddy paw prints and dog hair. 	
	If people see an event taking place, they are advised not to approach the participants, but to contact police immediately on 999. Residents who have information about hare coursing events should call police on 101 or Crime stoppers on 0800 555 111, alternatively on line at crimestoppers-uk.org
