### 012/16-17 Play Park

Cllr Simon King informed the meeting that the Parish Council had applied for a Rural Capital Grant but as the District Council owns the Play Park this grant cannot be awarded and there is a proposal for Benwick Parish Council to take over the Play Park from FDC and then be responsible for the maintenance etc of the Play Park.

It was pointed out that the question regarding the Rural Capital Grant was raised with FDC two years ago.

The Rural Capital Grant is for a substantial amount of money. Assurance was given that the Play Park would not be leased to Benwick Parish Council unless the Rural Capital Grant is approved.

It was stated that the Play Park was originally owned by Benwick Parish Council and the equipment in there has been funded by the Parish Council. Cllr King is happy to go back to FDC and ask if there could be an option of ownership rather than leasing for 20 years.

FDC has sought legal advice and would recommend that Benwick Parish Council seeks independent legal advice.

Cllrs are still behind the principle of improving the Play Park. Need to see what a proposal looks like and then seek legal advice.

The future costs of maintenance and inspections have been estimated by FDC at around £2k per annum.

Cllr Clark summarised the FDC position regarding the Rural Capital Grant, and how they wish to work with the Parish Council

Cllr Butcher gave an overview of the situation to date and how areas were handed over to FDC.

Cllr King advised that they were hoping to discuss this at Cabinet by end of May 2016, but they would have needed an in principle decision prior to that date. It was stated that the WREN grant has been accepted but may need to be reapplied for if the Rural Capital Grant is not forthcoming. The commencement has to be by July for the WREN grant.

Cllr Chapman believes that the Parish Council in principle agrees, wants to work with FDC, and needs legal advice.

Cllr King to look into Insurance requirements (Clerk to check), investigate why this has taken so long and also ownership as opposed to renting and Wren funding. It was Proposed by Cllr Chapman, and AGREED, that Cllr Chapman and Cllr King take the lead in this matter to develop a framework of two options to be brought back to the Parish Council.

Cllr Miscandlon also stated that the 106 monies could also be at risk if the Play Park development is delayed further

## 013/16-17 Police Matters

During the month of April 2016 there have been 19 incidents reported with only 1 incident impacting on the local community:-

11.04.2016 – Quad bikes and trial bikes reported on public footpaths in Benwick. Across Fenland and more notably in the summer months we get many reports of bikes/quad bikes being used in a similar manor.

Bikes/Quads:

You cannot ride off-road bikes/quads on any land, where the land owner hasn't given you permission. This also includes:-

Common land, Moorland, Footpaths, Bridleways, Restricted Byways, Canal Tow Paths, Disused Railway Lines, Green Lanes which are classified as roads

If you haven't got a driving licence, insurance, tax, MOT and if the bike doesn't have number plates you are breaking the law.

If you are caught riding your off-road bike, quad bike or off-road vehicle illegally, then you could face the following:-

Officers have the power to seize vehicles from uninsured drivers, and drivers that don't have a driving licence under Section 165A of the Road Traffic Act 1988.

You can be reported to appear in court for driving without insurance or a driving licence, as well as for careless or dangerous driving, driving without due care or
