

School News November 2023

We are now in our second half-term of the school year and have a very busy schedule planned with lots of exciting events to look forward to. We continue to

have our weekly Class Masses, The whole school came to church to celebrate the Feast of All Saints Day. Remembrance Sunday was a family mass where each class created a poppy display to take up to the altar. It was a very special celebration. The children read so beautifully, served, took part in the offertory procession and presented their excellent art work. Thank you everyone!'

In Religious Education we have been looking at Remembrance Day and the importance of not forgetting all those have died in the two great wars. Our theme this half-term is Prophecy and Promise. We are now focusing on Advent and the events of the Christmas story. Pendle Class will be looking at the sequence of the birth of Jesus from the Annunciation to the Journey to Bethlehem and looking at what happenend in Bethlehem. Parlick Class are looking at how we prepare for Christmas and finidng out more about Mary – how the way she said 'Yes' to God is still an important message today to all Chrtistains. Fairsnape Class are finding more about how Christians prepare for Christmas during Advent. They are also studying the parts of the mass and key events in the Church year. Beacon class are looking at the Book of Samuel from the Old Testament and finding out about the life and importnce of David – how Jesus followed him as the Servant King. and how we can prepare for Jesus' birth. They are also learning about the significance of the shepherds at the birth of Jesus.

All our classrooms are alive with beautiful displays showing some of the work covered this term. Pendle Class are looking at 'Transportation' ' and have are enjoyed listening to some of the books about different modes of transport written by Patricia Cleveland-Peck. The Story of Florence Nightingale is inspiring Parlick Class. They are also finding out about how hospitals have changed over the years..Fairsnape Class are studying Stonehenge linking to rcks and fossils. Beacon Class are focusing on at 'Food Glorious Food . They will be looking at Fairtrade Food and will also be creating their own mini class production of Oliver.
