## **From the Archives**

Earlier this month, in my update on the progress with the church roof repair project, I mentioned that we are applying for a grant from the Albert Gubay Foundation. Several parishioners have since asked me about the Foundation and in particular about the late Albert Gubay. A search on the internet revealed a fascinating account of an entrepreneur and philanthropist who was a devout Catholic.

Albert was born on 9 April 1928 in Rhyl, Wales, to an Iraqi Jewish father and an Irish Roman Catholic mother. He began his business career in North Wales selling non-sugar sweets during post-World War II confectionery rationing. When rationing ended in the mid-1950s, the confectionery business ran into difficulties and Gubay moved into retailing via market stalls. He founded his first business, 'Value Foods' on 11 May 1959 in Prestatyn. The company rented its first retail shop in Rhyl in July 1959. His aggressive price cutting resulted in some manufacturers refusing to supply him. Combined with ideas gained from the West German retailer Aldi, his business model was based on buying goods on favourable, net 60- or 90-days payment terms, distributing and selling them at or below cost before the payment fell

due, and using the interest on the resulting cash flow to fund the business.

His first major business success, however, came when he founded the first 'Kwik Save' discount branded store in Prestatyn in 1965. The store produced more sales than any of his existing Value Foods supermarkets. The second opened in Colwyn Bay, and by 1970 Kwik Save Discount had twenty-four stores. Just before it was floated on to the London Stock Exchange in November 1970, the company changed its name formally to Kwik Save Discount Group Ltd. In 1973, Gubay sold Kwik Save for £14 million. After selling Kwik Save, Albert repeated the low-price retail model in New Zealand, Ireland and the United States. He sold the stores for an undisclosed amount in 1986. Shortly afterwards whilst recovering from back injury and having by then moved into property development, he founded the fitness chain, 'Total Fitness'. He sold the chain in 2007 to the private equity arm of Legal and General for £70m.

In 1997, during an RTE television documentary he announced that he had made a "50–50" deal with God when he was young and penniless, to give half his estate to the Roman Catholic Church if he succeeded in becoming a millionaire. During the whole of his career Albert donated large sums of money to the Church. In 1998 Albert helped fund the building of a catholic church in Onchan on the Isle of Man, in memory of his mother. He has given millions to the Church and his Foundation still pays for Liverpool's archbishop and staff to fly to Lourdes every year. In March 2010, at the age of 82, he announced that he was to transfer £470 million of his £480 million personal fortune to a charitable trust to support Catholic churches and other charitable causes. The Albert Gubay Foundation was established in 2016 to continue Albert's philanthropic legacy.

On 23 February 2011, on behalf of Pope Benedict, the Archbishop of Westminster Vincent Nichols presented Albert with a Papal knighthood - the highest award a Roman Catholic lay person can receive - for his charity work. Albert Gubay died aged 87, following a short illness, at his home in Wilmslow, Cheshire, on 5 January 2016. R.I.P.
