Church Roof Repair - Update

During the last few weeks, a sub-committee of the parish property group has been working with the diocese to plan a programme of work to repair the church roof and to address other significant problems with the building. This will be the first of such articles with the aim of keeping you informed of developments.

Hill Chapel is an historic church building built in the eighteenth century. It is a Grade 2 listed building and is subject to several restrictions whenever changes to its structure or design are planned.

The Situation at Present:

• The church building requires significant work to address the failure of a number of wooden trusses which support the roof – including replacement of some slates.

• The ceiling is badly deflected and contains some asbestos cement which needs to be removed. A new ceiling, recreating the present decorative features, is to be installed.

• The church wiring has a safety certificate valid until 2026 but many of the wires and lights need to be removed and replaced. A complete rewire is envisaged.

· Post work re decoration to be assessed.

How the Work will be Carried out.

Francis Roberts Architects of Preston have been appointed as the project managers and Charles Blackett -Ord as Conservation Engineers.

There are a number of other interested parties that will be involved in the planning and delivery of the project. These include:

- Historic Churches Commission (HCC)
- Listed Buildings Authority
- Historic Churches Restoration Commission HCR
- Asbestos Professional Specialists

Timescale

The project managers will now prepare measured drawings to support the production of designs and specifications to rectify the problems. Once this is done, interested parties will be consulted and tenders for the work sought. It is envisaged that this planning process will take approximately six months to complete, with a start date for the work in April 2024. At this stage, the time needed to complete the repair work is uncertain, but it will involve the closure of the church for a short period of time. Alternative accommodation for Sunday mass will be arranged close to the church.

On a positive note, once this work is completed, the future of the parish and our beautiful historic church will be assured.
