

From the Archives

Remembrance Sunday 2023 Until a couple of years ago I and many of my generation, thought that we would never witness the horror of a full-scale war in our lifetimes. How things have changed! The

terror of the Russian invasion of Ukraine has brought the reality of war to our television screens. Trench warfare, symbolic of the battles of the Somme and Verdun in WW1 a hundred years ago, is once again a reality on the European continent. On October 7th this year, possibly an equally brutal war was sparked when the terrorist group Hamas invaded Israel in the Holy Land. Gaza City is now in ruins and the death toll is rising every day. Innocent people on all sides are sacrificed in the search by extremists and politicians for ideological power over their neighbours All this despite the lessons of history as to the futility of war. The Great War of 1914 – 1918 was named at the time. 'The War to End all Wars'. It claimed forty-one million casualties and involved twenty-one countries. Approximately eleven million military personnel were killed along with a civilian death toll of eight million. Six million additional deaths were due to war related famine and disease. Many others suffered major life changing physical or mental illnesses. Practically every family in Britain was affected and our own small rural parish lost seven parishioners. A further two were killed in WW2. One of our parishioners was Richard Moon. Richard was born in Broadway Lane, Goosnargh in 1887. Prior to WW1 he worked in farming. He married Bertha Coates in October 1911 at St Mary's Chipping; they had four young children. He joined the army in 1915 and trained as a gunner and was posted to France. He was killed in April 1918 in the battle of Villers - Bretonneux; aged 31, he is buried in a Commonwealth War Grave at Beacon Cemetery, France. R.I.P. Pope Francis implores us all to pray that those in a position of power and authority throughout the world, will strive for peace, tolerance and understanding amongst all nations. As a tribute to those who have lost their lives in conflict throughout the world, we too must work for peace in our homes, families, community, and society. I finish with two lines of the 1955 song by Pete Seeger, 'Where have all the flowers Gone'. Oh, when will they ever learn? Oh, when will they ever learn?
