**Special collection next Sunday -** World Mission Sunday We collected £291.50 from the Harvest Festival Celebration which is to be shared between church funds and Cafod.



# PAPAL CURIOSITIES

## What happens to a man when he becomes Pope?

- He assumes a new name and loses most of the civil ties that bind him to his country.
- He finds his daily life regulated often down to the most minute details.
- He has his own confessor who must be a Jesuit priest – who visits the Vatican once in a week at a fixed time and who may absolve the Pope of his sins.
- He finds that in theory he has full power over the Roman Catholic Church and every decree requires his approval. He can obey or ignore precedent. He can set aside tradition, write or rewrite constitutions, proclaim dogmas on his own and change discipline without consultation. Although on certain matters, the pope is supposed to seek counsel and advice from the College of Cardinals, he is empowered to make up his own mind and take action. On matters of high policy, he may do without calling in the curia of cardinals for their views, he may decide to go ahead with the Ecumenical Council.
- He finds he can be judged by no man. He is tantamount to a sovereign who cannot be brought to court.
