#### **School News**

We are now in our second half-term of the school year and have a very busy schedule planned with lots of exciting events to look forward to.

We continue to have our weekly Class Masses, The whole school came to church to celebrate The Feast of All Saints Day.

Remembrance Sunday was a family mass where each class created a poppy display to take up to the altar. It was a very special celebration and as one parishioner said 'Wonderful family mass, the children read so beautifully, served, took part in the offertory procession and presented their excellent art work. Thank you everyone!'

In Religious Education we have been looking at Remembrance Day and the importance of not forgetting all those have died in the two great wars.

We are now focusing on Advent and the events of the Christmas story. Pendle Class will be looking at the sequence of the birth of Jesus from the Annunciation to the Journey to Bethlehem and looking at what happenend in Bethlehem.

Parlick Class are looking at how we prepare for Christmas and how Mary and Jospeh prepared for the birth of Jesus and what happened next. Fairsnape Class are finding more about trust and how Mary put her complete trust in God when she was asked to be the mother of his son. Beacon class are looking at Advent and how we can prepare for Jesus' birth.

They are also learning about justice and researching people who have dedicated their lives to fighting for justice and peace in our world.

All our classrooms are alive with beautiful dispalys showing some of the work covered this term. Pendle Class have looked at 'Glorious Space' and have also enjoyed listening to some of the space books written by Oliver Jeffers The Great Fire of London is burning in Parlick Class. They are finding out about what caused the fire, what happenend next and how we know about this event although it happenned huindreds of years ago. Fairsnape Class are studying The Great Plague looking at the causes and the implications. Both topics have been enhanced by a visit from The Plague Doctor from Living History who delivered an intercative assembly for Parlick and Fairsnape classes, demonstrating different cures for the plague and talking about what life was like before the Great Fire. Beacon Class are focusing on at 'Let there be light', disocvering how light travels, how rainbows are created and having fun investigating and finding answers to their scientific questions.

As a whole school we are raising money for Children in Need by having a Pyjama Day. Our School Council are visiting County Hall in Preston.
