School News - June 23

We are now in the final half term of the school year and we have lots of exciting activities planned for the end of term.

We continue to have our weekly Class Masses, The whole school will be celebrating St Peter and Paul's Feast Day in Church at 10.30am on Thursday 29th June.

Sixteen of our Year Four pupils received their First Communion last Sunday at the 10.30a.m. mass on the Feast of Corpus Christi. It was a very special occasion and grateful thanks to all our parishoners who helped behind the scenes – in the sacristy, with the music, as altar servers and eucharistic ministers and preparing and giving out refreshments. You all contributed to making this an event that our First Communicants will remember, please do keep them in your prayers.

We are busy planning and rehearsing for our Music Showcase on Friday 14th July at St Thomas the Apostle Catholic Church in Claughton at 1.30pm. This will be a celebration of band, choir and musical theatre performances featuring over eighty children from both schools. Schools will be performing separately and together and you are warmly invited to attend.

This half-term we are having a visit from Olive who will update us on progress with our twinned school – the Shalom Academy in Kenya and talk about the progress that has been made since her last visit.

In Religious education we are looking at the impact that Jesus made when on earth. Pendle Class are looking at stories from the Bible that tell about Jesus' love and care for other people. Parlick Class are finding out more about parables and how Jesus used these stories to teach people about his Father in Heaven. Fairsnape Class are looking at the Church – what happens there and the roles that different members of Hill Chapel play in helping Hill Chapel to be a lively welcoming parish. They are also focusing on the importance of the Eucharist. Beacon Class are learning about Confirmation and how the Holy Spirit works within us.

All our classrooms are alive and colourful with beautiful displays showing lots of examples of the childrens work.

Pendle Class is alive at the Seaside. They are looking at story books that take you to the seaside: Gruffallo Park, Sharing a Shell, The Odd Fish and Mister Seahorse to name but a few. They are studying 'It's Up to Us: A Children's Terra Carta for Nature, People and Planet' which has a powerful message about what we need to do to slow down climate change and create a better future for everyone..

Parlick Class are also at the seaside and taking themselves to the resort of Blackcpool and seeing how it has changed over the years and making comparisons between past and present days. Both Key Stage One classes are planning a trip to Fairhaven and returning via Blackpool.

Fairsnape Class are finding out what the Romans did for us. They are starting with the Celts and and are enjoying learning about Boudiica. They are also finding out about the impact that the Romans had on our society when in England.

Beacon Class like to be 'Beside the Seaside'.too. In Science they are having a focus on electricity and are creating their own mini illuminations tableaus. They are busy preparing for their end of year Leavers concert – Pirates of the Curry Bean. This will be held on 12th July at 2pm and 6pm.

All Classes are preparing for 'St Francis Art Week' which will take place between $26^{\text{th}}-30^{\text{th}}$ June. – We will keep you updated.of when the Art exhibition will take place.
