STAY SAFE AND PROTECT OTHERS

Wear a mask at all times on church premises.

Covid regulations still require us to wear face coverings whilst singing hymns.

There is a one-way system in operation, throughout the church.

Entry to church is by the MAIN DOOR unless of course you require to use the ramp access.

On arrival, please wait outside the inner doors until invited to enter by a steward. If there is a queue, please observe the one metre rule when on the premises and until admitted.

On entry you will be asked to sanitize your hands and to have your contact details noted.

Entry into the sanctuary is by the door opposite the John Tweddle Room.

In an emergency or to use the toilet, please contact a steward.

Households are allowed to sit together, but it is recommended that there be two empty seats between household groups and individuals from separate households.

The only available toilet is the Disabled Toilet adjacent to the ramp. It must be sanitized after each use by the user leaving it.

We are serving tea & coffee during fellowship time after the service. But have to live within the current Covid regulations. We would ask you to please at the end of the service move to the tables & chairs provided, speedily & sit & wait while your drink is brought to you. We also ask that you continue to wear a face covering. We recommend that you observe 1 metre social distancing whilst moving about the church & whilst seated for refreshments, face coverings can be removed when you are having your refreshments but they must be fitted once you have finished your drink.

Please leave the sanctuary by using the door marked exit & leave the church building by way of the side door at the ramp.

If you have an offering for church funds please leave it in the bowl which can be found next to the exit door.

- To further engage with local communities to encourage more people into the wider church fellowship by appointing a Church Outreach Worker to plan, facilitate and help deliver community mission work across all age groups to ensure that the resources of the churches are used as effectively as possible.
- To grow the membership and fellowship by outreach into the community.
- To continue to improve pastoral care for the members, the fellowship, and the community.
- To spread the Good News beyond the church walls with church-led events out with the church building encouraging ecumenical and community friends to participate
- To grow worship leaders/participants.

It is good news that Annan URC have been able to re-engage with the local community once again with adult, youth and children's groups being able to use the premises for various activities.


