

#### Minister's letter

Dear Friends,

Someone asked me recently, "What does Lent mean?" so I thought I ought to do some research on the subject, some of which I'd like to share with you.

Lent has been observed in the church since at least 325 AD and probably since well before that. In the early church the period of Lent combined two major elements. Firstly it was a period of fasting and penitence leading up to Easter. Secondly it was the time when many people were prepared for baptism. In those days many were still baptised as adults, traditionally on Easter Day, after a preparation course during Lent.

Lent has a major place in the Christian calendar because it is important to prepare ourselves properly for Easter. Before a major event we get ourselves properly prepared. If we're going to take an exam we prepare for it by revising; if we're going to have a party we make the necessary preparations for food and entertainment. Easter is the most important time in the Christian year. At Easter we celebrate the events that lie at the heart of our faith, so it's important we do prepare ourselves properly.

In the past this preparation has rather stressed the negative aspects of giving something up for Lent. That is one way of preparing ourselves, but there are other ways. Many people find it helpful to use a book of Lent readings and there are plenty about these days. Many join in Lent groups which add another dimension to our preparations for Easter. Horsforth Churches Together are running a series of Lent groups this year and that will help give us focus over Lent. Some people prefer to do something on their own like reading through the whole of one gospel over the Lent period. During Lent we are particularly reminded of the fact that Jesus suffered many hardships and difficulties during his earthly life. He knows and understands the problems we face because he has shared in our human life and experience. We can offer all our concerns to God in the sure knowledge that Lent culminates in the final triumph of Easter Day when the power of sin and death was overcome.

It is necessary to look outside ourselves and our own rather feeble powers. In the Bible we read that if we ask for guidance and sincerely seek God's plan for us we may receive calm and blessings. We need to have our hearts and minds refreshed daily.

The Psalmist pleads, "Refresh my Strength" .This means that for thousands of years people have known that they cannot deal with their problems by themselves. Can I be bold enough to suggest that we look to Jesus every day. My Father used to say frequently, "One step enough Lord for me today, tomorrow's snags I will face tomorrow."

Don't be overwhelmed by the worries about tomorrow or next month. If we put our cards on the table of life and say that we need assistance Jesus can and will give us strength and calm to deal with whatever comes. "I am with you always even to the ends of the earth" he said. All you have to do is ask humbly for Him to come into your life and He will, and He will never let you down.


