A personal reflection by Phil Maud on the 17 months, and counting, of the Covid 19 pandemic.

I am sure that the seriousness of the Covid situation will have affected our way of living, our work, our family and our daily routine. Some will have lived through World War Two when the threat was tangible. We have been under threat from an invisible enemy. Both periods of history led to millions of deaths worldwide.

Perhaps you could take a minute or two to recall your own 'highs' and 'lows.' The things you missed and the fresh, positive insights that have come from this challenging time.

The church building has been closed and with it that 'God - focus hour' of Sunday worship. Our weekly church activities were also taken from us.

The Circuit sprang into action with zoom services and podcasts. When I was a lad a zoom was an iced lolly; steep learning curve there!

A weekly mail - out contained a written service, pastoral letters and news from the churches. If you received information by post you were one of 480 round the Circuit (just in case you felt like a minority against the email crew!). Circuit petrol costs were down but postage went up in lockdown.

We had to find out if our faith would hold up (without the preacher to explain the bible, the organ and choir to lead the hymns and someone to make the coffee).

We had to 'do' our worship at home. How did that work for you? Salvation on your sofa? bible study in bed? singing in the shower? and fellowship round the fireside? (unless you live alone).

We had to make a special effort to keep in touch with people; by phone, card, email or perhaps on a (socially distanced) walk, whilst carrying a coffee.

We were fortunate to have a small group of stewards and Alan meeting every 3 weeks throughout lockdown to work with both Mark and Jenny. Alan made the church 'Covid ready' and we took the first chance to open up for worship (minus singing and coffee!).

The addition of Zoom worship is down to a group of tech folk who have stepped up to the plate. At least you can sing your head off and have a cuppa to Zoom on your sofa!

The evening Circuit Zoom services attract approximately 70 devices, so this has been a Covid 'plus'.

Weekly postal letters, some Zoom coffee mornings, our website and social media have helped keep us in touch.

We have operated under national Methodist Church guidelines as follows: we were not allowed to 'ask' those over 70 (or with underlying health issues) but relied on 'offers'.

We are very grateful to all those who have seen a need and offered to assist. Those who have tech skills are especially valued.

Kenneth Kaunda was the first president of an independent Zambia, formerly Northern Rhodesia, from 1964 to 1991. He had been at the forefront of the struggle for independence from British rule.

He was the son of a Christian minister and a friend of some of our own ministers working in his country.

When he died earlier this year, there were fulsome tributes to him, but a few days later, I read this disappointing story.

The author remembered him saying:

' I think the white missionaries found me a difficult youngster. Each Sunday they sat in the front row of our church in padded armchairs. The black congregation – and that included my father- had to sit behind them on wooden benches. And yet he'd been a preacher longer than most of those whites. I got up in class one day and asked whether it would be the same in their heaven – blacks on wooden benches at the back? '

Everyone laughed, but not Kaunda. *Peter Reasbeck*
