AGM Notes - Friday 15th April 2011

The AGM was attended by 26 people.

Membership stands at 118, with 32 new members and 15 who have defaulted or resigned.

This has been a good year financially for the Group, recording our second largest ever surplus of £809, largely due to very generous donations at the East Farleigh Open Day. Fee income was up, at £205 compared with £150 last year, mainly for talks given on behalf of the Group, and guided tours of East Farleigh. Gift Aid claims for the four years 2006/7 to 2009/10 yielded £342, and a further claim can now be made for around £200.

General expenses were significantly higher than last year, largely due to the writing up of archaeological reports, and the use of an earth-moving machine at East Farleigh. The Group's finances are very sound, with cash assets of £4983. However, the coming year could prove difficult, with the loss of the East Farleigh site, so we must all endeavour to increase income and reduce costs wherever possible. After some discussion it was agreed that we did not yet need to increase subscriptions.

A demonstration of our website was given and the evening concluded with a book auction conducted by Albert, which raised a sum of approximately £52 plus Gift Aid where appropriate - thanks to all who donated and bought books.

Albert's Archaeological Roundup

East Farleigh: The dig is continuing for a final year. In May a one tonne excavator was hired to remove the overburden from Buildings 2 and 3, in order to fully investigate the purpose of these buildings by excavating the archaeological layers to floor level. Some interesting finds have already turned up, including a carved antler knife handle with a ring and dot decoration, and a portion of a circular pottery sieve (possibly part of a cheese press). For those who haven't been before and would like to join in, in whatever capacity, please contact me and I will send you a copy of our information for Volunteers. Access is through Lower Gallants Business Park (ME15 OJS), on Lower Road (B2010), just west of its junction with Gallants Lane, through a big green gate. If the gate is locked when you arrive, please phone Albert on 07964-395891 and he or one of the other diggers will come and open it for you. Drive down the track for about 150 yards and, on passing through the gate, turn left through some outbuildings onto the open field where you can park within a few yards of the excavation.

Excavations take place from 10am until approximately 4.00pm on Sundays and Thursdays.

Potyn's Field, Snodland: A walkover and metal detector survey of the final 25 metre strip of Potyn's Field has been carried out. None of the finds dated to before the last quarter of the 18th Century.

Final Open Day: Sunday, 31st July 2011

This will be our last year at East Farleigh, and we plan to hold a final Open Day at this most interesting excavation on Sunday, 31st July 2011. As in previous years this coincides with the Festival of British Archaeology. Volunteers are needed throughout the summer, please, in order to help with the excavation, cleaning and processing finds, etc. All offers of help on the day itself will be greatly appreciated. There will be plenty to do; such as setting up the displays, being on the gate, being at the membership recruiting table to talk to potential members, looking after the display tables, showing visitors where to park, etc.

Saturday, 13th August 2011 at 2pm: Following the interesting talk by Keith Parfitt that we had about the Folkestone Roman Villa on 18th March this year, a visit to the Villa has been arranged.
