AGM Notes - Friday 23rd April 2010

The AGM was attended by 26 people.

Membership stands at 95, with 23 new members and 16 who have defaulted or resigned.

David Carder circulated copies of the accounts and said that we had made a profit but expenditure was considerably up, and interest had dropped from £123 to £30 due to low interest rates. Funds had been boosted by three major donations: Mr. Baughan - £400, Kent Archaeological Trust £200 and the Mayor's Fund £440, for hire of an excavator at East Farleigh. David had sent off an application for 4 years' worth of gift aid, which should be over £300.

After some discussion it was agreed by a vote of 14 to 3 that we did not yet need to increase subscriptions.

Email Updates - 61 members have email addresses but only 37 have replied to emails asking whether or not they would like to go on the circulation list for information and updates between meetings. If you would like to be added to the list and haven't yet replied, please let me know, because I can only add people who specifically state that they would like to receive them. East Farleigh: The excavation recommenced on 25th April and will continue to take place on Sundays between 10am and 4.30pm probably until the end of September. Work this year is concentrating on the west end of building 3 and building 5. Thanks to a generous donation from the Mayor's Fund, we were able to hire an excavator to move the spoil heaps and remove the overburden from building 5. As a result, we now have a large area to trowel. Pottery, a coin of the Emperor Magnentius (350-353 AD) and a token have already been found.

Dover Roman Painted House: All Kent residents are cordially invited to visit the Roman Painted House, New Street, Dover, CT17 9AJ (Telephone 01304 203279) on the 24th and 25th July 2010 between 10am and 4.30pm. This special event is to celebrate 40 years (1970-2010) of archaeological excavation, publication and public presentation in Dover by the Kent Archaeological Rescue Unit.

Archaeologists who discovered the Roman House in 1970 will give site lectures at 11am and at 2.30pm. Admission charges are £3 adults and £2 concessions. There are toilets and a gift shop at the site, parking on the forecourt or in nearby public car parks. Mainline Priory Station is nearby.

Festival of British Archaeology: We have registered for this again this year and will be sent some free leaflets and posters nearer the time.

Maidstone Museum: Saturday, 5th June: Resident experts will be on hand to identify fossils brought in by visitors and children can dig for their own free fossils.
