Dear Fellow Members

Welcome back after our Summer break - a break from meetings, that is, but not from activities, as you will see below!

Archaeological Roundup

East Farleigh:

Work has been continuing at East Farleigh, despite the rain, and much progress has been made.

The trench to the east of the site was put in to explore a new wall that we discovered at the end of the 2012 season, which runs between buildings 2 and 3. This wall is on a similar alignment to the eastern wall of building 2, and is therefore probably contemporary with it. We have located the remnants of a floor surface associated with building 3, (the later structure that replaced building 2). This floor consists of a grey clay with stones pushed into it to form a metalled surface. The floor surface continues over the top of the newly discovered wall, confirming that the wall relates to an earlier structure that was demolished to be replaced by building 3. Finds associated with this trench include a small bone pin and a coin dated to 141 - 161 AD. This coin was a comemorative coin for Faustina I, late wife of Antonius Pius. The coin does not really assist much in the dating as large coins of this type tended to remain in circulation for some time. Frustratingly the wall does not appear to continue past the southern wall of building 3. This probably means that it originally turned at the point where it meets the south wall of building 3, making it very difficult to detect due to the later construction work for building 3.

We are currently concentrating on the large trench between building 3 and building 5. This has so far not provided us with any insights into the relationship between these two buildings. We have not found any paths or other structures as we had hoped. However, there have been many interesting finds, including two early bronze coins, several bone pins and a bone needle, as well as a number of small copper alloy pins and other items. There has been a good quantity of pottery recovered, much of it from a section that has first and second century material.

Our other main focus has been a ditch which traverses the site from east to west, and which we have seen sections of previously, but not a whole profile. This ditch appears to be early in date, first or second century, and it would appear to have been re-cut at some time. It is interesting in that it pre-dates all of the buildings on the site that we have discovered so far, and it is deep with very steep sides. Thinking of its use it is hard not to conclude that it is defensive in nature. One section of this ditch is almost excavated, and we plan to dig another slot through it before the end of this season's digging.

There is plenty more that can be done this year, so please come along if you would like to be involved.

Out and About

On 15th June some of our members visited the Wessex Archaeology store at Rochester and were shown around by Mark Williams and Lisa McCaig, who showed us some interesting finds and also demonstrated a customised GIS database which links plots, photos and finds records. Following this five members went on to visit the Brook Pumping Station at Chatham, and spent a fascinating afternoon looking around the building and artefacts.

Exhibition

We staged another exhibition at Maidstone Museum on 13th and 14th July to coincide with the British Festival of Archaeology and the Museum's 'Life and Death in Saxon Kent' weekend, where The Lead Scroll itself formed part of our display. We are pleased to welcome our newest members who joined the Group at this event, and thank our volunteers who helped.
