Welcome to the November Flyer

As has been the case during the last two years we will be publishing the Flyer on the Farringdon Web and Facebook pages during the current Coronavirus restrictions.

This year is the hundredth anniversary of the British Legion Poppy appeal and the cover picture is of poppies in Flanders Field.

There will be a remembrance Service in Farringdon Church at 11am to remember those fallen in all conflicts. Please be there at least 10 minutes early.

John McCrae wrote the poem *In Flanders Fields* which inspired the use of the poppy as a symbol of Remembrance.

In the spring of 1915, shortly after losing a friend in Ypres, a Canadian doctor, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae wrote his now famous poem after seeing poppies growing in battle-scarred fields.

> In Flanders' fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place: and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below. We are the dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved, and now we lie In Flanders' fields. Take up our quarrel with the foe; To you from failing hands we throw The torch; be yours to hold it high, If ye break faith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies grow In Flanders' Fields.

3. Declarations of interest in items on the Agenda none

4. Questions from the Public (15 mins only). *Members of the public participated*

5. Reports Cty Cllr. Henry Gent introduced himself to the PC and thanked the parish for electing him. He advised he will not be able to attend every PC meeting but will interact over specific issues. Particular subjects of interest to him are matters relating to flooding and waste to energy operations. He also advised that a speed limit trial was being undertaken at Newton Abbott which could result in significant speed control. This is due to be completed in 2023. He had attended the recent Airport Consultative Committee Meeting and there is a proposal to reduce Air Traffic duty on all domestic flights. A government consultation is taking place.

- 7. To confirm the Minutes of the 07/09/21 PC approved minutes and Chair J H signed off
- 8. Planning (No planning applications received) Planning Update: Several concerned parishioners had contacted the PC advising of apparent unauthorized development activity taking place at Hill Barton at the site which had recently had planning permission refused.. It is understood that work has now ceased and that EDDC are meeting with the Agent for further discussion. The PC requested the clerk to contact EDDC for formal notification of this.

No further planning matters were discussed

9. Parish Council Matters

a. Parishioner Concerns- Yet again high traffic speeds on the A3052 were raised by local residents. Cllr B Pearce advised that despite much work being done over the last couple of years by the Bishops Clyst Traffic Group no speed limit controls had been implemented. Cllr H Gent advised that supporting the survey at Newton Abbott would help. He is to forward the comment document to the clerk.

Local residents on the A3052 reported that despite the bad weather a few days ago. So far no flooding had been experienced. Residents will keep the PC updated.

b. Consultant re Air Pollution – Clerk advised that she had submitted all planning details to Sarah Radcliffe Curload Consultants. Sarah Radcliffe had forwarded a quote for all services relating to noise monitoring/ etc of £750 The PC agreed to this and advised Clerk to confirm acceptance of Curload Consultants quote. Clerk also informed the PC that she had emailed Dr Jane Clerk re Air Pollution evaluation but was informed that Dr Clerk was away on holiday till Monday.

c. Any other Parish Council Matters

The PC queried why no report on the fire at HB had been forwarded to the PC as requested. The PC also queried as to why no report on the permit for Brooke Energy had not been received by the PC. Clerk to chase up both matters.

WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritisation of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

Prevention is multi-layered and we need all its layers to be effective

We've drawn inspiration from Swiss cheese this week, and shared an analogy used by the BBC to describe <u>the importance of all prevention measures</u>, in the <u>fight against coronavirus</u>.

Case rates are rising. The vaccination programme is going well, with booster jabs among our older and eligible population, and vaccinations now available for 12 to 15 year olds.

But as effective as the vaccine is, it can't be used in isolation as a measure to combat coronavirus.

The Swiss Cheese analogy describes prevention as a range of different Swiss cheese slices. On their own, they're less effective, but combined, they offer much more protection against viruses.

It argues that alongside the vaccine, we need face coverings, regular hand washing, testing, socialising outdoors, distancing – all of these measures add up to a more effective level of protection and prevention than just one on its own.

We like the analogy, and thought it was worth sharing.
