On 24th March Farringdon will briefly become a little piece of Poland as a very special event will be held at our Village Hall.

On the evening of the 21st March 1943, a Mosquito Night-Fighter operated by the Polish 307 City of Lwów Squadron crashed as it attempted to land at RAF Exeter during a training flight. Tragically, the crew, Jan Michałowski (Pilot and Commanding Officer) and Stanisław Szkop (Navigator / Radar Operator) died in the crash, which occurred within the Parish just 1/2 mile short of the airfield boundary.

307 Squadron was based at RAF Exeter for 2 years and defended Exeter and the South West against German night bombing raids, particularly those of the Exeter Blitz April / May 1942. The Poles were very familiar to the local residents of that time, many of the officers being billeted at Farringdon House which had been requisitioned as an Officers' Mess.

A new memorial to both men will be unveiled by members of their families who are flying in from Poland especially. A number of Polish and local dignitaries will be attending, as well as representatives of a number of British based Polish related associations. It is hoped that local and Polish media will be in attendance too. An exhibition about 307 Squadron, the circumstances of the crash and the life-stories of the two Airmen involved will be held in the Village Hall.

The 24th was chosen for the day of the event to accommodate the personal availability of the Airmen's families plus it will mark the 80th Anniversary of their funerals at Higher Cemetery, Exeter, where a further event will take place after the one at Farringdon.

Anyone is welcome to attend, especially all Farringdon residents, past and present. The event commences at 1000 with the initial formal ceremonies. Thereafter, the exhibition will be ongoing until 1400.

Hosted by the 307 Squadron Project, an Anglo-Polish Charity organisation which researches the history and promotes the awareness of the Squadron.

There will be an opportunity to view the exhibition between 1000-1200 on Saturday the 25th and again after the Church Service on Sunday the 26th, from approximately 1030 until 1200.

Look forward to seeing you there.

Monthly Recipe - Lemon Bars

If you like the zing of lemon, you'll hopefully love these, great for packed lunches or a treat with a cuppa.

First line a 9x9" square baking tin. Next pre-heat oven to 180° or 160° for a fan oven (360°f or 320°f)

Shortbread base:

200g unsalted block butter 100g caster sugar 300g plain flour

- Cream together butter & sugar, either by hand, with a mixer or in a food processor.
- Add flour & form a dough, it should be crumbly but evenly dispersed.
- Press <u>firmly</u> into tin & bake for 20-25 <u>mins</u> until pale golden.

Whilst this is cooking, start on the topping:-

Lemon curd topping:

375g caster sugar 50g plain flour 6 eggs 225ml lemon juice Zest of 5 lemons

- Sift flour into a bowl. Add sugar & whisk until combined
- Add eggs, lemon juice & zest & whisk again
- Pour lemon mixture over shortbread, lemon mixture will be quite runny at this stage
- Return to oven & bake for 20-25 mins until lemon mixture is firm
- Leave to cool completely then refrigerate for 2 hours or overnight
- Dust with icing sugar

These can be frozen but never make it to the freezer in my house!

WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritization of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not he sitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

Vicar's article

The idea for this article comes from a most thought-provoking piece on "Thought for today" on Tues 07.02.03 at 7.50 am on Radio 4 (if it's still available, do listen to it. However, I am going to paraphrase it now for those who can't). It was given by Rabbi **Laura** Naomi **Janner-Klausner** and was spoken only a couple of days after the terrible news of the earthquakes in both Turkey and Syria She said this:

'[following the] 'earthquake the death toll is still rising (then about 4,000 dead). It has happened to lands still traumatised, one of them still shaking from years of war ... [Our] world leaders have rightly pledged to send support.

'As I watch the news from the safety of my home I alternated', she writes, 'between imagining showing how horrendous it is, and turning away to retreat to the safety of my home.

'As I did I was reminded of a client of mine who is a coach working with those affected by natural disaster; who told me that humans can live with the facts of natural and other disasters because generally we just don't believe they "will happen to us".

This can lead to two responses, she said:

'On one hand – it can be a good thing to build a retreat like this – a coping mechanism to distance ourselves from natural disaster. 'On the other hand it can allow us to be excused from sustaining a natural empathy to respond to such distant disasters or catastrophes such

She then refers to the Jewish Bible: 'Elijah also retreats when he feels under threat (by hiding in a cave). God's response is to say "Why are you there? Ge[t] out!" (spoken in a Cockney accent).

So Elijah stands outside of the cave and experiences the extremes of climate: earthquakes, avalanches, tornadoes and fire; cataclysmic sights and sounds.

Significantly the Rabbi says:

'In the aftermath of an earthquake every so often rescuers stand in complete silence _- just listening. They are trying to hear any sound of life obscured by noise of moving rubble.

'Elijah also experienced silence after the earthquake and having felt the presence of God. But that wasn't enough. Most important is what happened next: Elijah was commanded to act! Not just to listen or hide in a cave!

'So the quiet voice of God asked him:

"So, Elijah, what are you going to do now?"

This Bible reading is helpful when we are forced to deal with so much noise and pressure in our own life. Like Elijah, we need to move out of the safety of our own caves. So Rabbi Laura Naomi Janner-Klausner asked us to 'imagine ourselves along with the earthquake rescuers listening intently. Can we allow ourselves to hear even the slightest still small voice ...?

She concludes by asking 'so, what are we going to do now?'

In the Christian tradition, we can reply "Amen". But this means (probably) "So be it". So be "what". In response I repeat her final question: 'what are we going to do now?'


