MARCH GARDENING TIPS:



Plant bare root trees & hedging plants. Water well when planting if conditions are dry & mix bonemeal or fish blood & bone with the soil in the hole.

Clean and disinfect your greenhouse surfaces & glass.

Lift and divide overgrown clumps of summer flowering perennials to plant in other parts of the garden or pass on to friends.

The birds are starting to build nests: tie up sheep wool or dried moss near feeders to line their nests.

Plant up Dahlia tubers in pots with the stem just showing above the top of the compost and water.

Prune gooseberries - cut back all sideshoots to 2 or 3 buds from the main stems and the leading shoots by approximately 1/3.

Prune bush and shrub roses. You can be quite ruthless with established roses and the aim is to open up the centre to create air and space and prevent overcrowding and disease.

WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritization of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

A Tribute to Brian Curryer from his Sister

It's a real privilege for me today to be here giving this tribute on behalf of the family, to my wonderful brother Brian. When I look around and see how many people are here I realise that this is a true celebration of a life well lived and all of you, I'm sure, have your own stories of the many ways in which Brian touched your lives. He was truly a force and presence to be reckoned with!

Brian, as the firstborn, was born in Caroline House in the Exeter Road, Exmouth and was therefore a real Devonian, since Mum travelled from London especially for the birth. Ian and I always joke that he was more important than us as we both had to make do with London as our birthplace. *It's interest to note that both our names are a diminutive of Brian, heaven knows what a 4th child would have been called!*

Living in London post war for Brian and Ian was an adventurous time with plenty of freedom. They enjoyed the games of all cockney street urchins such as Knock Down Ginger which involved banging on the front door of a victim and then legging it, often leaving a 4yr old me to face the consequences.

Their first and foremost hobby was train spotting and Brian's love of trains was a legendary part of his whole life. They used to leave halfpenny cons on the track at Liverpool Station to be plattend by an approaching train. *(this morning I left Brian with a 1947 halfpenny, his birth year, to carry on the tradition!)*

The move to Devon in 1960 was a turning point for the whole family with Brian and Ian able to share their love of cycling, at one point in their teens cycling to London and back, a feat which I think nearly killed Ian!

As a career Brian was determined to join the Metropolitan Police and was devastated when turned down at interview, definitely their loss but in hindsight by far the best outcome for Brian. However, this put him on track to join the Royal Military Police, on the advice of a teacher, from which he never looked back. He began his training in Chichester in 1965 and his first posting was to Helmstedt Germany where he helped to man the Ckeckpoint Charlie border crossing to Berlin. Brian always told the story of nodding off on duty one day only to be woken by the sound of gunshots fired over his hut as someone escaped across the border. He never again slept on duty!

His next 2 year posting to Penang in Malaya was a very different affair and areal culture shock for a Devon lad, but friends were made and still kept to this day. The move to Plymouth meant frequent visits to Exmouth and it was then that he met Anne whom he subsequently married in 1972, which was the start of a 52 year partnership and a very happy marriage. They were clearly made for each other which makes his loss now all the harder to bear.

Whilst at Barnard Castle in Yorkshire Brian decided to apply for SIB training, (Special Investigation Branch) and he and Anne moved to London for 18 months whilst he trained at Hendon and was then attached to Great Scotland Yard. He became one of only 200 SIB officers overseeing numerous and sometimes distressing crimes that had to be dealt with quickly and efficiently. Brian was a master of his job and very well thought of by all his colleagues.

Moves followed to Osnabrook in Germany, Lisbon in Northern Ireland where he was seconded to the RUC, Colchester, Cyprus and Celle in Germany. Brian was amazed whilst in N Ireland to receive a surprise visit from Ian, who flew over and hired a taxi asking for the police barracks. Brian could never understand how he made it in one piece without being shot! Anne accompanied Brian on all his postings including the very dangerous N Ireland. It was a real partnership.

In 1979 Brian decided that he needed to change career before his time in the army came to an enforced end and, having reached the rank of Staff Sergeant, applied to join the Royal Devon and Cornwall Police. During his training he received the Hamilton Bobby trophy for being the smartest Bobby! Brian certainly wore his uniform well.

As a probationer at Newton Abbot Brian encountered his first female boss, not something he was used to! *(and a few choice words thrown in at the start)* The news of his first posting to Aylesbeare was not very well received by Brian, the idea of being buried in the countryside did not appeal! He was later sent to do CID training but quickly realised that the pace of work was infinitely slower than in the Military Police.

Aylesbeare for Brian was a turning point right from the very first knock on the Police House door when Oobi his Special Constable introduced himself, followed by a farmer reporting the loss of his ducks. A perplexed Brian asked Oobi what he was supposed to do and received the reply that there were no lost ducks but the farmer just wanted to look over him!

Brian was the ideal village policeman and could have been made for the role, treating it as a privilege to serve his patch and giving freely of his time with humour and common sense. The move to their first house in Farringdon in 1986 coincided with the birth of their very special and long awaited daughter, Michelle, who completed their lives and whom Brian adored. Brian loved the area and when retirement was again forced on him in 2002 began his 3rd and final career as a Firearms Enquiry Officer based at Cullompton, receiving a commendation for hard work and dedication in 2014. He remained there for 14 yrs until finishing in 2016 at the age of 68 when his retirement truly began.

Brian and Anne's final move was to their current, much smaller house with no hedge to cut! (*those of you who know Brian's hedge will understand what that meant!*) Brian loved it there and could spend time with Michelle, her husband Luke and his much loved grandson William, to whom he was known as "Pop".

This tells you the story of Brian's life but not about the man behind it. Brian was kind and caring with an amazing and wicked sense of humour, he would make fun of others but could also take a joke against himself. He would call a spade a spade and had his knuckles rapped on more than one occasion for a flyaway remark, which was never meant to be taken seriously. He cared for mum for many tears when Ian and I were too far away to help, he cut the church grass, he delivered the village magazine. In short, if ever a job needed doing Brian was your man. He was my big brother, my rock when both dad and mum died and it seems inconceivable that I shall never see his gorgeous smile or hear his laugh again. I take comfort from knowing that Brian lived his best life and enjoyed every moment of it.

You will always be in our hearts Brian (or perhaps I should say Brain since I've mistakenly written it so many times writing this) and we will never forget you. This tribute to Brian is not in what I've written but in the presence of each and every one of you today. Brian never wanted any fuss but how can you acknowledge such a man as Brian without it.

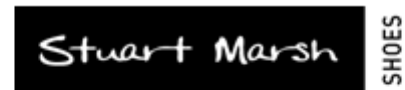
