Our thanks goes out to Jerry Bird for all of his work in arranging the day on behalf of the 307 Squadron Project.



Monthly Recipe – Simnel Cake

Easter will soon be here & this was my Mum's simnel cake recipe, I hope you enjoy it & Happy Easter! Maggie

8oz plain flour
6oz butter or marg
6oz soft light brown sugar
Pinch of salt
3oz mixed peel
12oz currants
3 eggs
1/2 tsp of nutmeg
1/2 tsp cinnamon
Zest of one orange
Milk to mix
1 packet of marzipan (or make your own: mix 12oz castor sugar, 8oz ground almonds, 1 egg, splash of lemon juice)
1 tablespoon of apricot jam

Method:

Line an 8" cake tin with parchment paper.
Preheat oven, 150° (130° fan oven) , gas mark 2
Divide marzipan roughly into thirds. Put 1/3 aside for the balls (apostles). Using the base of the cake tin as a template, roll out 2 circles (one circle will go in the middle of the cake, the other will go on the top)
Sieve dry ingredients & add fruit, peel & orange zest
Cream butter & sugar thoroughly then beat in each egg separately
Stir in dry ingredients & mix together with a little milk to give a "dropping" consistency
Put half the mixture in the cake tin then place your first marzipan circle on top, then add the rest of the cake mixture
Bake for around 2.5 hours but test by poking it with a skewer in the middle of the cake, if the skewer still has soft cake mix on it, return to oven for up to another 30 mins.
Once cooked, allow to cool, then spread apricot jam over the top of the cake & place the 2nd marzipan circle on top. Make the remaining third of marzipan into 11 equal sized balls, to signify the apostles, place these around the edge of the cake & secure each one with a tiny blob of apricot jam.
Lastly place under the grill to brown but don't take your eyes off it as it will catch really quickly, you want it gently browned, not cremated!

a. Review of Strategic Planning Meeting 07-02-23. *Cllr J Chanot reported that she had attended the meeting and spoke up on behalf of the FPC regarding the concerns re the Local Plan process. During the Strategic Planning Meeting the subject of Neighbourhood Plans was raised and it was mooted that future NPs should include an allowance for housing.(Farringdon has an allowance of 12 properties under our NP policy Farr6.)*

b. Update on Local Plan Process

The Local Plan process is on hold whilst awaiting the result of the forthcoming NPPF policy from the government. The required housing numbers are likely to change.

c. Any other planning matters - none

9. Parishioner Concerns-

a. *– Parishioners raised concerns that very tall intrusive glaring lights have appeared seemingly at the Tarmac Plant. – Clerk to contact EDDC*

b. *- Parishioners raised concerns once again re the deteriorating condition of Spain Lane particularly in relation to the substantial commercial traffic of very large vehicles travelling to the Digestate Lagoon. Residents reported to the PC that the sign at the start of the lane advising that this is unsuitable for large vehicles is continually ignored. – Clerk to contact Highways*

- The Layby near the A3052 is now totally blocked by seemingly permanent large commercial vehicles and causing much concern for residents who regularly use the lay by for short term parking. Complaint to be raised with Highways/EDDC/Helen Selby once again- Clerk to action

WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritization of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

Preparing for a flood

Vicar's article

On the Sunday before Mothering Sunday I preached a sermon based upon an encounter that Jesus had with a Samaritan woman at a well. It fitted well with being shortly after "International Woman's Day". Jesus' male disciples were shocked to see him speaking with a woman, a Samaritan too. They didn't understand that it was for precisely those who didn't easily fit in that Jesus came. He overturned the religious niceties of the day with a more compassionate concern for the outsider.

The other day I was part of a group meeting, looking at the funding and composition of one of our local magazines, which is moving towards being more community-based. I have always tried to keep the vicar's letter as 'broadly' interesting as possible, and hope that this, together with the announcement of church services and church events, reflects the church being part of the local community/ies which I hope is a good thing.

However, like most of us, I want to have my cake and eat it (a peculiar expression which I have heard explained sensibly, but for another time). So I will continue trying to throw in the occasional religious ball from the left field, to keep us on our theological toes! Perhaps I should try and avoid too many mixed metaphors though.

It is far too easy for those of us involved in running churches to be inward-looking and only concerned with our own congregations. I often quote a previous Archbishop (and forgive me if you have heard this before), William Temple, who famously said:

"The Church is the only society on earth that exists for the benefit of non-members."

Saying, or speaking, these words is, however, quite different from putting them into practice. So let's hope our various magazines will reflect the needs of all of our community.

New emergency alert system launched by UK Government

You may have heard in the news that the [UK Government's new Emergency Alerts system](#) is now live. The system will enable people to be contacted through their mobile phone if their lives are at risk in an emergency. The service will be used to warn you about life-threatening emergencies, for example severe flooding.

Emergency Alerts are messages sent to all compatible 4G and 5G mobile phones when there's a danger to your life, health or property in the area you're located. They don't need your location or phone number and only the Government and the emergency services can send them. If you don't have a mobile, you'll still be kept informed through other channels.

There will be a UK-wide test of the Emergency Alerts system taking place on Sunday 23 April 2023. If you have a compatible phone, you will receive a welcome message. You do not need to do anything when you receive it, as it's just a test to ensure the service is working effectively.

Emergency Alerts have already been used successfully in a number of other countries, including the US, Canada, the Netherlands and Japan, where it has been widely credited with saving lives, for example, during severe weather events.

Wild About Devon is a Devon Local Nature Partnership initiative, focusing on supporting local communities to restore and improve habitats for nature across our diverse landscapes.

There are four award categories:

- Wildlife Community of the Year
- Wildlife Parish and Town Council of the Year
- Wildlife School of the Year
- Outstanding individual

A panel of judges will select three winners in each category, based on the steps they've taken to improve the wildlife value of an area as well as the social benefit of their activity.

Winners will receive certificates on the night as well as other great prizes that will aid their conservation efforts.


