- **5. Reports** Chair advised of report from Cty Cllr S Randall-Johnson which will be emailed round all PC.
- 6. Report from Chair Chair advised for the record that Parish Cllr. Antony Hill had resigned with immediate effect (email dated 01/09/23) Clerk had thanked Antony for his contribution particularly during Covid.
- 7. To confirm the Minutes of the Farringdon Parish Council Meeting /08/2023

The PC unanimously confirmed the minutes and chair JH signed off.

- 8. Planning
 - a. Update on Local Plan Process Cllr E Rylance advised that no further clarification had yet been forthcoming from central govt. re the NPPF and target numbers for housing were still unclear.
 - b. Any other planning matters none

9. Parish Council Matters

a. Co-option of parish councillor Jerry Bird (a longstanding Farringdon resident) was proposed for co-option by Chair J H and seconded by Vice Chair NH. The PC welcomed Jerry to the parish council. Jerry completed required Acceptance of Office Form and Register of Interest Forms. Clerk A S signed off.

- b. Parishioner Concerns Complaint had been submitted by a resident re the increased traffic on the A3052 . The traffic had also been exacerbated by the Car and Cuppa event being held at Greendale on a Sunday. Chair will speak with site owner. The PC re iterated its frustration and concern regarding the disappointing decision by Highways not to extend the 40mph past the Cat & Fiddle. It was agreed that a letter should be sent to DCC re iterating the concerns of danger for all residents living alongside the A3052 and those using the road on foot. Clerk to compose.
- **c. Proposed footpath project** *Cllr J Chanot advised the PC that she had walked the Public Right of Way alongside Princes Paddock and that it had been strimmed and was now free and accessible. Clerk to ensure it is in The Flyer. Cllr. JC also raised a query as to whether a path could be formed along the verge of the A3052 from Waldrons villas up to the bus stop lay bye opposite Greendale entrance. Clerk to contact TG at DCC*

WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritization of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

Help the homeless at St Petrock's

Homelessness charity St Petrock's (StP) is appealing for items of food, toiletries, cleaning items, clothes, rucksacks and sleeping bags to help people through the autumn and winter months.

The charity has compiled a <u>'Harvest Festival Wish List'</u> to give people an idea of the sort of things they are after.

Rowan Livingstone, Homelessness Services Manager, said: "If you haven't had a proper tour of the StP Centre you may not know that underneath is a Crypt.This is a hidden bonus to being based in an 11th Century Church as we use it to store all the tinned/dry/long life goods that we try to make last through the year."

"But - this year our shelves are more depleted than I've even seen, and I would be so grateful if you could check out our Harvest Wishlist, share it far and wide, maybe see if your workplace could set up a collection?"

"We go through an incredible amount of food and drinks every week – The team make at least 25 hot drinks each morning on our Breakfast outreach and we provide hot or cold drinks for those coming into the Centre. Our Kitchen volunteers make approx. 25-30 breakfasts and 30 lunches every weekday. Anything left over at the end of the day we take to supported housing partners."

"It is humbling every day to remind myself that St Petrock's survives on the generosity of donations from local supporters, businesses and faith groups – we try to make sure this kindness is felt by all those who come to us for help, and a hot freshly cooked meal is often something that brings a smile to someone having a tough time. A new client this week who came in for a shower, laundry and fresh clothes, then stayed for lunch, told our Kitchen team that he 'can tell this delicious cake was made with love'. It was warm from the oven raspberry sponge with custard, and there was none left at the end of the session!

Due to the very damp Summer in July/ August, St Petrock's are also short of waterproofs and sleeping bags. Men's items such as jeans, joggers, boxers and trainers are a constant need for the charity if anyone can spare any. These can be taken to their shop, Petrock's Place, in Paris Street.
