Easter Eggs through the Centuries

The custom of giving eggs at Easter is very old. The first Easter eggs were just ordinary hard-boiled egg, painted or dyed. In some places in the north of England this is still done. In Germany, there is a tradition that green eggs are eaten on the Thursday before Easter. They are died by boiling them in spinach. In Greece, people used to dye eggs red for Easter, using the eggs as a special greeting. Each person carries an egg, and when two people meet they knock the eggs together, saying "Christ is risen!"

During the Middle Ages eggs were not allowed to be eaten as part of the Lenten fast. So Easter Sunday became a day to celebrate with the eating of eggs. Children used to go house to house, singing and begging for eggs. They were paid in hard-boiled eggs, dyed with vegetables such as beetroot (red), spinach (green), onions (yellow)and tea (brown). The eggs were called *pace* eggs, the word coming from the French *Pasque*, which means Easter. Eggs became a symbol of the rock tomb out of which Jesus emerged to new life. It is appropriate, therefore, that in Christian homes, eggs be decorated with religious and liturgical designs, such as the cross, the rising sun (Son!), water, candle, etc.

WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritization of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

A Message from the Vicarage



I learnt a new phrase the other day, which seems appropriate in a (post-) pandemic age: it is "spiritual pain".

I had, of course, known about it before, I'd just not used that name for it. It seems appropriate too for those of us who are accompanying those who have terminal illnesses.

I went on an excellent Zoom course run by Sarum College, in the cathedral close in Salisbury – worth a visit. On the course were various people engaged in caring from a Christian perspective. In my small group everyone was either supporting someone who was dying, or had had a close brush with death themselves.

This spiritual pain affects old and young alike – one example was of a ten- year old whose father was rushed into hospital with Covid, who couldn't see him. The whole family regularly attended church, but the mother couldn't answer the question as to why this was happening; all she could do was to hold her child.

We talked briefly about the age-old problem as to why God allows pain and suffering. The seminar leader quoted CS Lewis, who said this about pain:

"We can ignore even pleasure. But pain insists upon being attended to. God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our conscience, but shouts in our pains: it is his megaphone to rouse a deaf world." (*Pleasure of Pain*, 1940). Not all will find this quotation helpful; I read it to my mother who wasn't sure about it. It speaks to me, however, as one who has a low pain threshold.

CSLewis, like us responding to the crisis in Ukraine, would have known what the effect of war had on people, but he could see beyond the simple resource of blame – to blame either the aggressors in war, or the creator God. A response, which notably is not an answer, is found in the Psalms and in the book of Job. It is that of "lament". It might be helpful for us to rediscover the act of lamenting.

One way to do this is to try and write our own psalm, crying out to God. Don't restrict your language (!); the original psalmist didn't – "Why are you letting this happen, God?", for example.

I'm going to finish this article by quoting a powerful story of an Anglican priest I once knew, whose young son, aged about two, had been wrongly diagnosed with a terminal illness, but he didn't yet know that the diagnosis was wrong. He tried asking God why, but got nowhere in his prayers. Then once, when out on a walk, he swore at God: "Why the whatever are you allowing this to happen?" After that, he felt that he was at least being real in his conversation with God. I can't recommend the swearing; but I can one hundred percent endorse being real before God in our prayers.

So, if you believe in God, or even in a powerful force out there somewhere, even if you struggle to pray – try to be real, and shout out to our God, even in pain. The answer might not be what we want, or in the time scale we want; but rest assured, God hears.


walk 4 life
