This month's cover picture is of one of the the **Birth Flowers for July**, the Larkspur or Delphinium.

Everyone knows about their zodiac or birthstone. But, not many people know that there's actually a birth flower too which has its own special meaning! Knowing all about birth flower meanings can come in very handy when choosing the perfect <u>birthday flowers</u> to send someone. So here's our guide on every month's birth flower and what characteristics go along with them!

The **July birth flowers** are delphinium and water lily. Water lilies were named after a Greek nymph and are said to symbolise purity, unity and finding peace and balance. With associations of positivity, delphiniums are very much happy, cheerful flowers to brighten up someone's day! They're also a classic, British bloom and can be found growing wild in many woodlands across the UK.

Interestingly, delphiniums got their name from the Ancient Greeks who thought that the shape of the flower bud looked like a dolphin's nose. (Which we can totally see!) There are hundreds of different species of delphiniums these days and many of them can grow to be 6 foot tall.

The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritization of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

Vicar's article and brief health update

I wrote the following update on my health a few days ago; my apologies for those of you who expect a more spiritual article! However, I do believe very much in the need to keep a healthy balance of mind, body and spirit (however much this phrase is misused), so I don't apologise that much.

More seriously, I wanted to write something – briefly – about grief.

As many of you will know, my stepson died about six weeks ago, in early May. Daff and I are still sorting out his house in Plymouth, ready for its eventual sale. Needless to say, we are still struggling with the grief involved. Daff more than me; also at the moment she can't face coming to church.

I asked her about coming this last Sunday, she thought about it ... and promptly burst into tears. It is ironic that the one of the things which might help us – church, praying, getting closer to God, is difficult when people, thoughts and emotions get in the way.

I know that I struggle when people ask me how I am, at the moment. Do I give an honest answer: *not very well, really*. Or an avoiding answer: *so, so,* or a "white lie" - *I'm fine, really*. Sometimes we don't know how to converse. However, Daff and I both went to a wedding away (in Porlock) and survived, even enjoyed it. But we did avoid the photos, and left the food early.

So what am I trying to say: please remember and pray for those who are grieving, those whose health status is changing. Please continue to be sensitive in how to contact them and offer support in other ways.

It has made me think about how well, or not, we do this in our church buildings. I hope, that once my current health scare is dealt with, that I (and Daff) can be fully restored to you all. I also hope that our churches continue to be places of refuge, peace and tranquillity for all who struggle in whatever form. Blessings be upon you all, Bill

My health update

Having been diagnosed with prostrate cancer – about medium risk - I am receiving hormone treatment, and am now on regular three-monthly injections.

I am about to have my first oncology appointment, on Mon 20/06/22, when I shall learn more about my suggested, radical, treatment. This is because I am seen as relatively young and fit(!) I shall be able to tell you more after that point.

I have been given a sick note for the last four weeks, as I was struggling with the effects of a double dose of hormone treatment, but am now mostly much better, apart from the occasional hot flushes!

I am still holding the WCMC in my prayers, and, as ever, am so grateful to all clergy, churchwardens and other lay people who are keeping things "on the road". I have been more than impressed with the services I have been able to attend – including a wonderful outdoor thanksgiving service for Her Majesty's platinum Jubilee.




