This month's cover shows the Cenotaph in Whitehall with Remembrance Sunday coming up on 13th November. This will be the first year that Charles III will be attending as King.

In FarrIngdon we will be holding our normal Holy Communion Service precede with a gathering by the War Memorial in the Church porch. We will meet in Church at 10.50 in time for the two minutes silence at 11.00 pm in the porch. The service will then continue in Church.



The Farringdon War Memorial is positioned above the door in the porch. This enabled all who fought to be included.

The seven who died in the service of their country are marked with a cross.

There are no names for the second world war as, unlike in the Great War, Farringdon being a rural community had residents in reserve occupations such as Farming. These residents were involved in other capacities such as the Home Guard and some in Churchills Secret Army. WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritization of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

Preparing for a flood

Please refer to Devon County Council and Environment Agency web pages for advice on what to do before, during and after a flood. In the first instance of flooding and sandbag requests contact your local District or Parish Council to be directed to any local sandbag supplies that may be available.

Flood Warning: Flooding is expected. Immediate action required.

Severe Flood Warning: Severe flooding. Danger to life



Councillors on Tuesday 1st November were set to recommend endorsement of the draft local plan which outlines plans for further housing growth across the district over the next 20 years. The Strategic Planning Committee were recommended to approval the plan for consultation.


<u>The preferred site for the new town would span land north of the</u> <u>A3052</u> near Crealy Adventure Park to the A30 near Exeter Airport. The indicative boundary would see it spread towards Farringdon in the east, and out towards Westpoint to the west. To the north, it would run towards the junction between the A30 and Exeter Airport, and across the farmland between the sites.

Option 1 - the preferred option - for a new town in East Devon

Option 3 is an alternative location to be consulted on, but is the second favourite It is a site which spans from the edge of Clyst St George to the west, to Woodbury Salterton to the east. The boundary of the site would head towards the edge of Woodbury to the south, while to the north, would run as far as land next to Crealy Adventure Park and the Cliff Hill Training Ground.



Option 2 – the report says – should be discounted. This site would have bordered the A3052 next to Crealy, running out towards Greendale Business Park to the south of the road, and out towards Farringdon and around Hill Barton Business Park to the north of the A3052.

THE NEW TOWN

Amongst other key facilities this scale of development will be appropriate to ensure that a secondary school is planned and built to serve the new town with potential capacity to also support needs generated from surrounding areas. A new town will be a long time in the planning and it is unlikely that any new homes will be completed until around 2030. The second new town will, therefore, see most of its development happening outside of the life of this local plan and potentially running beyond the mid-point of the 21st Century.
