

4.Report from Chairman- Chair J H reported that during the Covid lockdown period the PC had continued to hold meetings via zoom. In addition to commenting on planning applications, the PC had repaired signposts, and followed through with the NP process. He thanked everyone on the parish council for their consistent support throughout the year.

5. Village Hall Report - Village Hall Report 2020/21

As can be expected, due to Covid restrictions the hall has been closed for a great deal of the last year. When it has been open regular bookings such as the square dancing on Monday and Wednesday mornings have not been able to take place.

Luckily Danny Watts was able to hold Gym classes in the hall for 3 months on and off, depending on lockdowns, and he is due to resume these, all being well from 17th May.

Sue Heron was also able to hold a two day clothes sale in the autumn and will be holding another one in June. Finances have been greatly helped by the Covid Government Grant received in the Summer of £10,000, some of which has been spent on two new storage heaters. These have been left on low throughout the winter to avoid any dampness in the hall. We have also had wifi installed by Jurassic Fibre, the first year of which has been at no charge.

WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritisation of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

THE VICAR WRITES...



Magazine Article June 2021 - recovering Judas!

I am not, now, a betting man, but if I were, I would offer you a hundred to one on this bet. I want you, in your heads to list the first (or Christian) names of all your acquaintances - up to say one hundred or so. Then group them together if they share the same name. My bet is that none of them will be called "Judas". Most English-speaking Christians would probably not choose to use that name. The name itself is a Hellenised version of the Jewish "Judah", coming from the Hebrew for "to praise". So – do I owe you £100, or do you owe me a quid – only joking!

What happened to Judas? He killed himself, we know that, according to two different accounts in the Bible, but they disagree in the manner of his death. We assume because he couldn't live with what he had done; but do we know that for sure? The gospel writers are clear (that is Luke in Acts and the author of John) that this was to fulfil Hebrew Scripture; but they would say that, of course.

But did he go to hell? And if he did; did he stay there? Since about the middle of the last century; there has been an attempt to re-evaluate Judas and his role. D.L.Sayers, and many others have followed, chose to make him a *Zealot*, like Simon the Zealot, who thought Jesus should have brought in his "kingdom" more quickly and effectively, presumably by force. This works well dramatically, but is it true? Probably not, but we don't know – it's as plausible as most other explanations.

In Holy Week, on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter Sunday, there is an Orthodox, and Catholic, tradition that Jesus went to hell and "harrowed" it; I have an icon which reflects this. Often Jesus is seen pulling Adam and Eve up out of hell. I like the idea of Jesus doing this with Judas, as one Catholic website suggested; but of course there is no Biblical source for this.

Whatever *did* happen to Judas, I think, in this modern age it is time to re-examine him and his role in the Passion of Christ; perhaps he just had to be there to do what he had to do. Maybe, just maybe, that might be a help when someone calls us a "Judas", or even that we have betrayed them. Others have gone before us. And maybe, just maybe, Jesus redeemed Judas after death – who knows.

Before I get accused of heresy, I would like to close with quite a well-known, I think powerful poem, called the *Judas Tree*; I know nothing about the author – maybe a reader could tell me. Let's not be too quick to condemn.

The Ballad of the Judas Tree

In Hell there grew a Judas Tree Where Judas hanged and died Because he could not bear to see His master crucified.

Our Lord descended into Hell And found his Judas there For ever hanging on the tree Grown from his own despair.

So Jesus cut his Judas down And took him in his arms. "It was for this I came," he said, "And not to do you harm.

My Father gave me twelve good men And all of them I kept, Though one betrayed and one denied, Some fled andothers slept.

In three days' time I must return To make the others glad, But first I had to come to Hell And share the death you had.

My tree will grow in place of yours. Its roots lie here as well. There is no final victory Without this soul from Hell."

So when we all condemn him As of every traitor worst, Remember that, of all his men, Our Lord forgave him first. Ruth Etchells


