The cover picture this month is of the bluebells at Blackberry Camp which will be well worth a visit this month.

Blackberry Camp

Over 2000 years ago a group of Iron Age farmers dug out tons of earth from surrounding ditches to create the ramparts for a hill fort. Today we can see the remnants of all their hard work in the woods at Blackbury Camp.

Where to find it: look for the brown signs on the A3052 Sidmouth to Lyme Regis road. The camp is near Southleigh, Colyton, EX24 6JE, about 15 minutes drive from Sidmouth.

Parking: there's a small free car park immediately beside the earthworks, plus parking in the lane nearby.



USE YOUR VOTE!

FARRINGDON NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REFERENDUM MAY $\mathbf{6}^{\text{TH}}$

The referendum on the Farringdon Neighbourhood Plan takes place on the 6 May, in the Village Hall based on a new planning document designed to strengthen the District Local Plan. Unlike the District's Local Plan any Neighbourhood Plan must be approved by residents through a referendum so it is vital that it reflects those issues that local people feel are important. The Farringdon Neighbourhood Plan has been created following three years of consultation with residents and businesses across the parish and clearly states the key issues that have been identified. The Neighbourhood Plan will help determine how Farringdon develops up to 2031

You can vote in the referendum if you live in the parish of Farringdon and you are on the electoral register. If you are not on the electoral register you will need to register to vote. Contact the elections office at East Devon District Council or register online at <u>www.aboutmyvote.co.uk</u> The referendum is being held with the Police Commissioner and County Council elections.

You will be asked: Do you want East Devon District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Farringdon to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area? The Farringdon Neighbourhood Plan will come into force if a majority of those who vote support the Plan.

- 2. Apologies of absence- Cty Cllr R Bloxham,Cty. Cllr S Randall-Johnson Due to election councillors have refrained from submitting reports
- 3. Declarations of interest none
- 4. Questions from the Public -.one member of the public participated
- **5.** To confirm the Minutes of the PC meeting 14/01/2021 PC approved the minutes of 14/01/21. (clerk to liase with chair and drop off to be signed asap.)

6. Planning –

a) 21/0403/FUL - Greendale Farm Greendale Lane Clyst St Mary Exeter Proposal: Demolition of existing barn, dairy and milking parlour; replacement single dwelling *The PC have no concerns re this application.*

8. Parish Council Matters

a. Parishioner Concerns-

Parishioners raised concerns re- smell, noise and the profile of the bund at Hill Barton Business Park. The Environmental Health Officer is being contacted and the parish council will be kept informed.

b. Neighbourhood Plan Referendum- The voting on the NP is to take place with local elections on May 6th. The PC advised that it is important that as many parishioners as possible turn out to vote on the NP. Clerk to discuss with SG methods of advertising this to the parish.

c. Co option of new parish councillor. *Cllr. Angela Fletcher had submitted her resignation prior to the meeting. The PC thanked Angela for all her hard work and contribution to the parish council over several years. Notices of a vacancy had been advertised as required by statute, for 14 days. During this period no applications had been received other than from Mrs Jane Chanot. Chair JH proposed Mrs Jane Chanot to join the council, and this was seconded by Vice Chair NH thereby filling the vacancy. Jane was welcomed onto the parish council.*

d. Any other Parish Council Matters- *Cllr. J Chanot informed the PC that a section of the road near the cattery was in very poor condition. The PC advised that a photograph and exact location of the area would be needed. On receipt of this the clerk will forward to Helen Selby at Highways.*

10. Any other business – clerk advised that she had received information from DALC stating that the law regarding remote parish council meetings was changing and after May 7th the PC would be required to meet at the village hall albeit with Social Distance/Covid regulations still required. The PC agreed it would be best if the Annual Parish Meeting and the Annual Meeting of The Council could take place before this date. It was resolved that all 3 meetings should be held on May 4th 2021 via Zoom.

11. Confirmation of next PC meeting - May 4th 2021. Chair closed meeting at 8.35pm

THE VICAR WRITES...



Bill Lemmey Woodbury Vicarage

I read the following idea for an assembly; adapted it a bit and then used it. It uses some of the different messages found as potential explanations in each of the four gospels. What do you think? I wonder what the children will think?

Here it is - edited a little for space reasons: after the opening news headline, pause and ask yourself what your response would be.

The "beeps" from the News sound.

Newsreader:

Good morning and welcome to Lady Seaward News. Our main headline today: a man has *risen from the dead* after three days. [*Newsreader*

freezes]

Leader. What do you think? Would you turn off the radio, or would you want to hear what the newsreader has to say? [pause]

Newsreader. The disciples of Jesus of Nazareth, killed by the Romans, are claiming that he has *risen from the dead*. Our reporter in Jerusalem is at the site of the garden tomb.

Reporter: Amazing scenes here in Jerusalem where, as you can see, the tombstone has indeed been *rolled away*. No obvious sign of a body within. I am standing here, next to the empty tomb where, just three days ago, Jesus was buried. Jesus' followers are convinced that he has been *resurrected* and *defeated death*.

Mary: I saw him. I thought he was the gardener. But no! He knew my name; it was really him.

Peter: It's true, I tell you! The body has gone; there is nothing left but grave clothes, and the huge stone has been *rolled away*! *Reporter*: Not everyone believes that Jesus has *risen from the dead*, though, and the Jewish and Roman authorities are keen to dispel the dangerous rumour.

Person 1: I don't believe it. It's nonsense! No one can survive crucifixion! I think the women who came to anoint the body went to the wrong tomb! *Person 2:* Well, I don't think Jesus really died on that cross. He probably survived, bribed the soldiers and then escaped. He simply pretended he was dead so that he could pull this stunt!

Person 3: I'm not so sure you can trust those disciples, you know. I reckon they've stolen the body and hidden it. Then, in order to cover their guilt, they've invented this story to say that Jesus *rose from the dead*. Whoever heard of someone coming back from the dead!

Person 4: I saw his followers after Jesus was crucified. They were full of grief, proper crazy! Grief can do funny things to people, you know; they've probably had hallucinations – seeing him when he wasn't there.

Person 5: Well, I can't think that they'd lie. Maybe Jesus could have *risen from the dead.* Maybe he was as powerful as he said.

Reporter: What do you think is the best explanation? We must each make up our own minds.

Leader. The resurrection, the reason for Easter and a key tenet of

Christianity -what for you is the best explanation? And ... if you agree what this unlikely event is true ...

A MESSAGE FROM DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

Be cautious, if we're to avoid an upturn in cases

Positive cases of coronavirus in Devon have levelled off, following a period of decline.

"Now is another critical time, if we're to avoid an upturn in cases again," said Steve Brown, Director for Public Health Devon.

Until recently case numbers in Devon had been falling, but the data for the latest available week show rates are stabilising.

"The latest data is beginning to cover the period since restrictions have eased. At the same time, the vaccines are rolling out to younger priority groups.


"Naturally there's optimism in the air, and although that's good news, I do want to repeat the need for us all to remain very cautious, otherwise we will start to see those case numbers in Devon rising again.

"Right now, the vaccine alone is not the single solution. It's vital that the measures that we're all familiar with – keeping our distance, wearing face coverings when indoors in public spaces, and washing our hands regularly – remain part of our everyday lives.

"The restrictions at the moment allow meeting in groups of up to six, or two households, outdoors only. So while the evenings are still a little cool, please do not be tempted to take your gathering indoors. Outdoors, in the fresh air, is safer as it reduces the chance of the virus being transmitted."


