This month's cover is to highlight that Harvest Festival will be celebrated this year with a Communion Service in the Church at 6-30pm followed by a supper in the Village Hall. Details are later in this copy of the Flyer.

Birth Flowers for October are the Cosmos and the Calendula or Pot Marrigold.



The cosmos is a member of the sunflower family. It is a herbaceous perennial or annual, ranging from one to six feet high and with flowers in a huge range of colours.

One member of the genus, Cosmos atrosanguineus, is a real conversation piece. Its red-to-almost-black flowers are gorgeous to look at – but take a sniff and you'll find out why its common name is chocolate cosmos. It was first described by William Hooker, who travelled the world in search of plants and became director of Kew Gardens in 1841. Although common in cultivation, it has not been seen in the wild since 1878.

As a birth flower for October, the cosmos is associated with order, tranquility, and balance.



Calendula officinalis, the common or pot marigold, is a popular annual plant with yellow to orange daisy- or chrysanthemum-like flowers. For reasons that are not clear, the first part of its Latin name comes from calendae, meaning calends, the first day of the month. Officinalis derives from oficina, the part of a monastery where medicines and other items were stored, because the marigold was believed to have healing properties.

The common marigold is still widely used around the world to heal cuts and bruises. Its flowers and leaves are edible, and can be used in soups, salads, and other dishes. It also makes a spectacularly eyecatching garnish.

Calendula is not to be confused with the African and French marigolds, which are members of the Tagetes genus. As a birthday flower for October, and because of its resemblance to the sun, it is associated with warmth, love, and creativity.

### WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritization of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

#### Preparing for a flood

Please refer to Devon County Council and Environment Agency web pages for advice on what to do before, during and after a flood. In the first instance of flooding and sandbag requests contact your local District or Parish Council to be directed to any local sandbag supplies that may be available.

Flood Warning: Flooding is expected. Immediate action required.

Severe Flood Warning: Severe flooding. Danger to life

#### Vicar's article

God save the King! What strange words to write now, which many of us by now have sung. I sang them for the second time at Woodbury Salterton church, with schoolchildren who sang very well. The first time was at Clyst St. Mary, which was more of a practice!

How many of the children in our parishes have got living grandparents or a great-parent even? What about the other way around. How many readers have grandchildren, great-grandchildren even? A few of you will have known the previous king, George VI, but for most of us, including me, the only monarch we have known is the Queen.

She has been constant, there all the time in the background, performing her many, many duties. I found out the other day how many letters she received a year – staggering. I wonder how many she had to write. Many people in our communities treasure some communication from her. An example to us all, not just of constancy, but of steadfastness and faithfulness.

What does that mean? Well, as the Dean of London said on the Sunday after her late majesty's death, steadfastness is more than constancy. It means being an ability to be relied upon. Who is there for us to rely upon? Our families, if we have them, perhaps. Or friends, partners? In a more general way, we all, adults and children, rely upon our country and its constitution. The Queen has always been there, for most of us.

God is described in the Psalms - and elsewhere – for his faithfulness and steadfast love. I've talked about being steadfast, our new king, Charles III, as a mourning son, has talked a lot about love. We need to all learn to love each other, and God.

So three words to help us: steadfastness, love, and finally, faithfulness. Our Queen regularly went to church and her faith, her belief in God, sustained her, kept her going, all the years of her life. We can all learn from this, let's, like her, be faithful, steadfast - and show our love for each other and God throughout all the rest of our lives.

Let's hope that we all too have long and rewarding lives. Let's give thanks for the Queen and pray for our new monarch. God save the King!

This is the first of an occasional number of blogs that I hope to write while I am undergoing radiotherapy. This first one was written the day before the state funeral of our beloved majesty, QEII. They are a mixture of poetry, prose and prayer; use it as you wish.

"A time for reflection"; often have I heard these words and yet – how little I understand.

How can our new King find time to reflect? How did our heavenly King find time to withdraw?

By creating space ... Space I found in Sunday Worship, this am, on radio 4.

Time to withdraw, and think, and write. *There is a time to speak ...and a time to be silent.* 

"If ever there is a time to be silent", said our Scottish reverend, this is it.

In the silence of our hearts, in the stillness of Holyrood Palace, in Westminster Hall, wherever ...

Be still - and listen.

Contemplate.

In the midst of our daily aches and pains, be still.

Listen to our world, to nature, to manufactured noise, and - be still.

In the silence, let tears come, if eyes stay dry, let our hearts glow. Let the light shine.

As angels guard the tomb, may they take our thoughts heavenward - as an incense offering of prayer and praise - even in our infirmity, our brokenness,

Let us be still - and listen.

Amen.
