By Seamus Heaney

Round hayfields, cornfields and potato-drills We trekked and picked until the cans were full, Until the tinkling bottom had been covered With green ones, and on top big dark blobs burned Like a plate of eyes. Our hands were peppered With thorn pricks, our palms sticky as Bluebeard's.

THE VICAR WRITES... Two Weddings and a Funeral!



I have said a few times in the last few days that I feel a bit like Hugh Grant! Not really. But I do feel as if I have landed in the Mission Community; with an over-representative time spent in Clyst St Mary. Technically it was two weddings and a funeral over three days; but if we make the period eight days, it will have been two weddings and two funerals. I mustn't grumble – I gather Nigel once took four funerals in a week (I think – perhaps even more).

Ages ago, I wrote another article for my previous parish magazine called 'Three Funerals and a Wedding'; this time spread over five days. The most interesting part of the article was that, in this case, it was the wedding that was the most difficult; because I was in 'funeral mode'. However detached we are as clergy, or should be, inevitably we pick up some of the feelings that are 'kicking around' - so what was difficult then was switching from grief to joy and back.

This time around the feelings are different, but in a way similar. Daff and I are in the middle of processing not very good news about her son, now in hospital having treatment (don't ask us at the moment for any more details). I received this news just after the funeral today, on Monday. Emotional rollercoasters do cause us some hassle and we need to be aware of that – it's where support mechanisms are so necessary. Let's make sure that the church (in the broadest sense of the word) offers that.

But in case I'm sounding too serious, there was one very amusing aspect to one of the weddings, which I'll finish by telling you about – all who attended church on Sunday, for real, or by *Zoom* forgive me for repeating myself – but it's a good story.

All three weddings were very different, all seemed to be appreciative, which was nice; all had good reasons to be held this year, and soon. Anyway, at this particular wedding, at one of 'my churches', there was an over-keen young man giving away the bride (not the father, I hasten to add). He'd learnt the words he had to say: when I said the well-known words: 'Who gives this woman to be married to this man?', he had to say, 'I do.' Well...he remembered the words all right, but the timing was slightly awry.

A little earlier in the service, I asked another question and paused before I moved on. Bright as a button he piped up, 'I do.' Unfortunately the question was: 'Does anyone know of any reason why these two should not lawfully marry?' Oh dear...

Fortunately I said, 'I'm going to ignore that', assuming it to be a joke in bad taste, and continued. At another point 'I do' was said again, and then I realised who it was. Luckily the third time he got it right, and should have deserved the round of applause he got at the rehearsal. But it's the first time I've ever had an interruption at that point – let's hope it's the last!

The point of my Sunday sermon was that we need to find the right time to say 'I do', when God is nudging us to do something. Perhaps that might be when a neighbour or a friend is on their own rollercoaster; let's pray to have the courage to say 'I do', when asked for support. Blessings.

Greater Exeter Strategic Plan

Below is an email from a Farringdon resident with concern about the GESP which East Devon District Council have just pulled out from. His concerns are still relevant to EDDC's revision of their Local Plan which they will be working on shortly.

From a local resident:

For reasons best known to themselves Exeter Councillors and planners want to turn Exeter into a huge metropolis that would swallow up large amounts of Devon countryside and lots of local villages. Perhaps they think that if it is big enough, Exeter will become a unitary authority like Plymouth and have greater autonomy and more power.

So, I wonder how long it will be before Farringdon disappears into "Greater Exeter" and becomes a distant memory? Our local roads will be imaginatively renamed as "Logistics Park 4 West" or more poetically as "Brambleside Close" - even though there will be no hedgerows anymore.

This is because "local business interests" and council planners have a vision, unfortunately. Exeter cannot possibly stay as it is. Exeter must grow. The new huge city must attract thousands of people who must have jobs. Large sheds must be erected, new shiny supermarkets must be provided. And the developers will promise to provide all sorts of amenities - large landscaped parks and allotments, community centres, doctors' surgeries, and so on. And everyone will cycle to these new shiny supermarkets and to their new jobs along new cycle lanes.

Or perhaps not. Because we all know what what we will get - vast soulless housing estates full of identical housing "units". And polluted roads into Exeter clogged up with yet more traffic.

It could be a sad story. Most local Devon villages near Exeter may be swallowed up and disappear. After all, none of us can stop "progress" apparently. But there is some room for optimism. Hurrah for East Devon and Mid Devon district councils. They have refused to join in the planning stages for this new ruthless Monster Exeter and want local Devon places to keep their identity. So perhaps local people are going to have some say about "progress" and their futures after all. Keep your fingers crossed!

INFORMATION FROM DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

Changes to school transport

The government has produced <u>school transport guidelines</u> for when all pupils return in September and we've been working with schools, colleges and transport operators to help them plan for this. We have also created our own guidelines

Social distancing guidance applies to passengers on public transport, but not to passengers on dedicated school transport, (which are not open to the general public). This is because the government believes the overall risk to children and young people from coronavirus is low; they do not mix with the general public on those journeys, and the home to school transport carries the same group of students and young people on a regular basis.

To help keep everyone as safe as possible, we're asking pupils aged 11 years old and over to wear a face covering when travelling on school transport, unless they are exempt from wearing one.

Children will also be asked to sit in their year groups on larger vehicles wherever possible, with the youngest students sat at the front. Schools can draw up seating arrangements if they wish, and to be on hand at the end of the school day to assist students.

We're also providing around 70 extra buses across the county at peak times, which will be dedicated to school and college students, so there's extra capacity for social distancing measures on public services.
