Welcome to the September Flyer

As has been the case during the last few months we will be publishing the Flyer on the Farringdon Web and Facebook pages during the current Coronavirus restrictions.

I always knew the recipe as Bramble Jelly and I remember my Granny using a cloth bag held over a pan on a brush handle to sieve the berries (I think the string broke once with rather messy consequences!

The Edible Hedge

In September, the edible hedge and all the other hedges around the fields are filled with berries and fruits. It is certainly one of the best months of all for foraging. The blackberries are in their prime just now, the rosehips and hawthorn berries are ripe, wild pears and crab apples

are ready to use and the sloes are almost soft enough to pick.

To make Bramble Spread

800 g blackberries 800 g sugar

In a large pan, slowly heat the blackberries with 300 grammes of sugar and 120 ml of cold water and gently cook until the berries are soft.

Push through a sieve to get rid of the pips, then put the juice and pulp back in the (clean) pan with the remaining 500 grammes of sugar.

Over a low heat, stir to dissolve the sugar and simmer (not rapidly boil) for 20 minutes, still stirring.

Pour into ramekins or small jars, cover and label. Best eaten after two or three months during which time it will thicken a little more.

a. 21/1719/PDR Proposal: Change of use from agricultural to flexible commercial use (class B8) Location: Rosamondford Farm Perkins Village EX5 2JG Applicant: Mr S Slade Rosamondford Farm Perkins Village EX5 2JG

The PC reviewed the application and concern was raised that the location was not suitable for a transport hub and would have a major negative impact on local residents. Strong concerns regarding this application had also been submitted to the PC by several local residents. The road was far too narrow. The application did not comply with the Farringdon Neighbourhood Plan Policy Farr 6. It was agreed that a site visit would be useful to confirm the concerns re transport access. Councilors to arrange and advise.

Aylesbeare PC Comment advised :- " Aylesbeare Parish Council supports the concept of farm diversification but cannot support this application because of the doubt over the number of vehicle movements caused by the undefined new uses.

The Council is also concerned that storage operations would require additional hardstanding for an unknown quantity of vehicles to park and to allow turning. The lane to the farm is extremely narrow and has limited width, poor alignment and substandard junctions. It would struggle to cope with a significant increase in vehicle movements."

WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD0

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritisation of investment. If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding, you should not hesitate to call 999

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on 0345 155 1004 or visit the Roads and Transport webpage. Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call 01392 383329

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5, A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on 0300 123 5000 (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on 0344 346 2020 (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on 0345 155 1015 or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

Flood Alert: Flooding is possible. Be prepared.

Flood Warning: Flooding is expected. Immediate action required.

Severe Flood Warning: Severe flooding. Danger to life

Warnings no longer in force: No further flooding is currently expected

THE VICAR WRITES...

The Way under our Feet



The above title is an apt title for a book I strongly recommend by Graham Usher, former Bishop of Norwich.

It is subtitled, a little more helpfully: "A spirituality of walking". Unfortunately I only found a copy after my dissertation had been written; but it is what I was writing about, with reference to the poetry of Coleridge and Wordsworth.

No doubt I will be writing more on this theme at another time; but I used one of his anecdotes last week-end when Daff and I went back to Porlock for our somewhat late "leaving-do!"

It appears under the chapter heading of "Remembering". He is writing about the merits of walking in front of the hearse, when there is a short distance to go – it helps him "remember" in a helpful way in his body; I agree with him about the value of walking here, but, like him, I also remember slightly inappropriate conversations with funeral directors (not from around here of course!)

Here is his anecdote: having left the church door with the commendation, the funeral director and he walked with the coffin on a somewhat squeaky trolley (not everyone's favourite, it has to be said). Graham, then a vicar, says:

"Which way are you going to the crem?"

After the reply, Graham says: "Go slow, and I'll pop into Greggs so I can get some lunch – I'll be at the crem before you. "I always go slow" says the funeral director, "only 20 mph. What are you getting".

"Only a sandwich"

"Those Christmas flavoured pasties are nice".

"My mind boggled", thought the vicar, as he contemplated the enumbers in a Christmas flavoured pasty.

But then he said more generously; "Why, do you want one?"

At this moment, one of the churchwardens, charged down the churchpath at speed, overtook the coffin, and – yes you've guessed it – said:

"Do you realise you've left your radio-mike on!"

Unsurprisingly, the vicar then decided he had little appetite for lunch, and none whatsoever for Christmas-flavoured pasties! Well, it happens to us all, if not so spectacularly.

At least to those of us who take funerals, that is.

So - an amusing story; but is there a point? Yes – we need to walk alongside those who grieve, if possible, with some sensitivity. And know when to laugh at ourselves, and not take ourselves too seriously. Let's hope we can all be in the right place, at the right time, for someone who needs support – whether bereaved or otherwise. And let's learn how to go at walking pace in our lives, and not rush everywhere. Perhaps that way there'll be a positive post-Covid legacy.
