Prince Philip, RSA President (1952-2011)

Friday 16 December 2011. *Princes Consort in History.* To mark the 150th anniversary of the death of Prince Albert, and also the 90th birthday of Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, the Institute of Historical Research, in collaboration with the Society for Court Studies, is bringing together a range of international historians to look at the influential institution of the male royal consort from Ferdinand of Castile to contemporary personalities in western Europe at this all day conference.





To: WSG Chairman, **Dr Nicholas Cambridge** has been awarded the Freedom of the City of London by the Worshipful Company of Apothecaries.





Quentin Blake CBE, RDI

On the 30th anniversary of his election to the Faculty of the Royal Designers for Industry the illustrator Quentin Blake has been awarded the 2011 Prince Philip Designers Prize.

Now in his 90th year the Prince has stepped down from the prize after 52 years of extraordinary dedication to promoting and celebrating design, with his expert and insightful leadership. Quentin Blake has produced illustrations for over 300 books, including works by Roald Dahl (for which he is perhaps best known), Michael Rosen, Joan Aitken as well as his own books. He has also illustrated the work of Dickens, Carroll and Lear.

Included in the short list for this award were fellow RDIs Sir David Chipperfield, Stephen Jones, Sir Paul Smith and Dinah Casson who has just been elected Master of the Faculty.



Sir David Chipperfield, elected to the Faculty of RDIs in 2006, has won the first Critics' Circle Visual Arts and Architecture award for his designs for Turner Contemporary in Margate and Hepworth Wakefield, both of which opened earlier this year. He is currently working with the Geffrye Museum on plans for the Museum of the Home due for completion in 2015.

Exhibitions

Albertropolis: the Development of South Kensington and the Exhibition Road Cultural Quarter



Architecture Gallery, 128A, V& A Museum, South Kensington, London SW7 2RL. 11 December 2011 to 4 March 2012. Free admission. Drawing on previously unseen objects from the V&A and RIBA collection, this display charts the development of South Kensington and the Exhibition Road Cultural Quarter from 1851 up to the present day. It examines how the site became the architectural embodiment of Prince Albert's ambitious cultural aspirations.

Radindranath Tagore: Poet and Painter. Room 38A, V& A Museum, South Kensington, London SW7 2RL. 11 December 2011 to 4 March 2012. Free admission

To celebrate the 150th anniversary of the birth of Rabindranath Tagore (1861-1941), the V&A will hold a display of about 50 of his paintings from the period 1928 to 1939, never before displayed outside India. (See WSG newsletter no.29 on Tagore and the RSA)




Images of Surrey: Watercolours by John and Edward Hassell. The Lightbox, Chobham Road, Woking, Surrey, GU21 4AA. 17 December 2011 to 19 February 2012. Free admission. Both John and Edward were Society of Arts prize winners. John was awarded a Silver Medal in 1810 for improvements in aquatint, and Edward won silver medals in 1828 for an oil painting of the altarpiece of St Margaret's, and 1829 for a painting of the interior of Edward the Confessor's Chapel.



On the 55th anniversary of the laying of the foundation stone for the rebuilt Coventry Cathedral by HM the Queen a blue plaque was unveiled on the former home and office of the cathedral's architect at 1 Canonbury Place, Islington, on 23 March 2011. In 1960 the RSA appointed Sir Basil Spence member of the Faculty of RDIs for his outstanding work in the fields of interior design and exhibitions, such as 'Britain Can Make It' and the 'Festival of Britain'. As an architect he is best known for his modern design for Coventry Cathedral, for which he received his knighthood. He is recorded as saying that 'his life's wish' was to design a cathedral, and that he 'felt certain that architecture could rise to greatness if its goal was Faith'. The Royal

Commission on the Ancient and Historical Monuments of Scotland undertook a major project to catalogue and conserve nearly 40,000 drawings and other material which his family presented to the Commission in 2003. Robert W. Stimpson, William Kennish RN 1799-1862. Isle of Man: Manx Heritage Foundation, 2011. ISBN 978-1-907945-08-3. £25

This book considers the life, naval career and inventions of William Kennish who died in Brooklyn 150 years ago. The content includes technical writings, poetry and 180 drawings, figures, photographs and paintings of ships he served on, the areas he explored and the inventions he developed including an artificial horizon he submitted to the Society of Arts. Also included in the biographical section is a photograph of Kennish's grandsons working on the plinth of the Statue of Liberty.

The author is offering a £2 discount to WSG members and RSA Fellows who wish to purchase a copy of this book. He is also writing up the story of the prize winning artificial horizon and its examination by the Society's Committee of Mechanics for a future issue of the newsletter.

Anniversaries

2011 marks the **200**th anniversary of the award of the Society's Gold Medal to H. Andrews of Wakefield for his plantations of Oaks. Sadly death snatched the honour of accepting this award, which he had been so anxious to obtain, from him, but the Society directed that the medal should be presented to his daughters.

2011 marks the 150th anniversary of the death of Prince Albert, Prince Consort of Great Britain – see page 1 of newsletter.

2011 marks the **100**th anniversary of the death of Maung On Ghine, a member of the Society of Arts from 1900. He was an active and public-spirited member of the Rangoon Municipal Council and represented the Province of Burma at the Coronation of King Edward VII in 1902.
