WELCOME TO VISITORS

Until further notice our church is now kept closed during the day. The beautiful stained-glass windows were made at Buckfast Abbey and the unique 30,000 piece mosaic represents St Paul, as the "scales fell away from his eyes" (Acts, 9:18). The picture above the sanctuary is the now world-famous depiction of the Last Supper by a local artist. The statue in the corner is of St Paul Shipwrecked. It is a copy of that in the church of the same name in Valletta, Malta (see Acts, Chapters 27 and 28:1-11). The statue of Our Lady on the right hand side of the altar is of Serpentine stone. Also at the front of the Church in the right hand corner, you will see a reconstituted marble statue of the Holy Family. This statue was presented by 'The Friends of the Holy Family' and blessed by Fr. Bryan Storey R.I.P. Our church has become a place of pilgrimage.

lota

On Wednesday 20th December at 4:00 pm a service was held at St Materiana



and its churchyard to commemorate the events of exactly 130 years before (to the hour) when the Italian barque lota sank off Lve Rock, Willapark in Bosinney in a horrific storm. Three members of the crew drowned, but nine others were saved through the brave efforts of several local residents and the coastguard. The service ended in the churchyard where the refurbished memorial was blessed and wreaths were laid at the graves of Domenico Catanese, the drowned 14-year-old ship's boy, and Mr Charles Hambly, one of the four brave rescuers. About 40 attended, including members of H. M. Coastguard, the National Coastwatch Institution and the WI, and Mr Jon Woode who sang a song about the boy during the service. St Paul's was represented by Fr Paul and other parishioners.
